

GENTLEMEN:

THIS IS A REPORT OF THE CONDITION, ACREAGE, PRODUCTION AND VALUE OF AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS IN SHASTA COUNTY FOR THE YEAR 1976; SUBMITTED AS REQUIRED BY SECTION 2279 OF THE CALIFORNIA AGRICULTURE CODE. THIS REPORT REPRESENTS THE GROSS VALUE OF PRODUCTION AND DOES NOT ATTEMPT TO SHOW COUNTY INVENTORY, NET FARM INCOME, OR COST OF PRODUCTION.

PRICES RECEIVED FOR AGRICULTURAL COMMODITIES WERE GENERALLY HIGHER IN 1975. WALNUTS AND ALFALFA WERE PROBABLY THE BIGGEST GAINERS. WALNUT PRICES WERE UP, AND ALFALFA VALUES GAINED STEADILY THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. EXCEPTIONS TO THIS TREND WERE BEANS AND HONEY, WITH SLIGHTLY REDUCED VALUES.

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION GENERALLY IN 1976 REMAINED AT APPROXIMATELY THE SAME LEVEL AS 1975. THE PRODUCTION STATISTICS OF CALENDAR YEAR 1976 REFLECT MINIMAL DROUGHT INFLUENCE DUE, IN PART, TO FAVORABLE EARLY GROWING SEASON CONDITIONS. RANCHERS CONTINUED TO INCREASE LIVESTOCK MOVEMENT TO MEET CURRENT MARKET AND FEED CONDITIONS.

MOST RANCHERS AND GROWERS ARE STILL FEELING THE CONTINUED PRICE SQUEEZE OF HIGHER OPERATING AND FEED COSTS WITH LOW PROFIT MARGINS. AGRICULTURAL COMMODITY PRICES CONTINUED TO RISE, BUT AGAIN FELL SHORT OF INFLATED PRICES AND INCREASING TAXES.

INFORMATION FOR COMPILING THIS REPORT HAS BEEN OBTAINED FROM PRODUCERS, GOVERNMENT AGENCIES, REPRESENTATIVES OF AGRICULTURAL BUSINESS, AND INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE SPECIAL KNOWLEDGE. IN THEIR FIELD.
