Since the passing of Prop 64 in November of 2016, commercial cannabis production throughout California has steadily increased, although a slight decrease was experienced statewide in 2022. While cultivation of cannabis for personal and medicinal use is allowed in the unincorporated areas of Shasta County, growing commercial cannabis for resale is illegal. With proper licensing, the City of Redding and the City of Shasta Lake allow businesses to grow and sell indoor grown cannabis. In 2022, there were 38 active licenses registered with the Department of Cannabis Control (DCC) California. According to statistics provided by DCC, 165,673 plants were harvested, totaling 33,885 lbs of product produced within Shasta County in 2022. The total estimated wholesale value was \$22,533,000.
