### MINUTES OF MEETINGS MARCH 19 AND 26, 1962

On motion of Supervisor Wagoner, seconded by Supervisor Morgan, and carried, the minutes of the meetings of March 19 and 26, 1962 are approved as mailed.

## COUNTY CLAIMS

By motion regularly made and unanimously carried, County Claims #5210 to #5771, inclusive for General, #996 to #1110, inclusive for Hospital, and #5734 to #5840, inclusive for Road Improvement Fund are approved as presented by County Auditor W. F. Weber.

### WELFARE

On motion of Supervisor Morgan, seconded by Supervisor Perez, and carried, Welfare Cases are approved as presented by Marian Babiarz, Welfare Director (see Welfare Minutes).

### LIABILITY OF RESPONSIBLE RELATIVES

By motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Wagoner, and carried, the Board of Supervisors determines the liability of responsible relatives as submitted on a list by Welfare Director Marian Babiarz.

### CHAMBERLAIN, CLAUDIA

Welfare Director Marian Babiarz discusses the matter of General Assistance for Claudia Chamberlain and her four pre-school age children. Mrs. Chamberlain will be eligible for ANC in July; however, until that time, she has no means of supporting her family. After much discussion, motion is made by Supervisor Morgan, seconded by Supervisor Perez, and carried, that Mrs. Chamberlain receive a rent order in the amount of \$65.00 per month and commodities for three months. 2 April 2, 1962 (Welfare, Continued)

### WORK PROGRAM: RENT AND UTILITIES

Marian Babiarz, Welfare Director reports a request from the Department of Public Works for six men to work five days each cleaning the Redding Memorial Hall. This will leave each man with a balance due after he has received his allotment of commodities. By motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Wagoner, and carried, the Board of Supervisors authorizes Welfare Director Marian Babiarz to issue rent and utility orders for the balance due.

## CRIPPLED CHILDREN'S PROGRAM: BUDGET

Welfare Director Marian Babiarz reports that the County has used all the funds budgeted for the Crippled Children's Program and that there are no more funds available from the State for this fiscal year. After general discussion, the Board of Supervisors authorizes Welfare Director Marian Babiarz to hold all bills until next year's budget, on motion of Supervisor Wagoner, seconded by Supervisor Perez, and carried.

### FARM ADVISOR

Walter Spivey presents a letter from the University of California advising that Jesse Bequette, Shasta County Farm Advisor, and County Director has been transferred to the University of California at Davis campus to assist in the statewide livestock program. The University further advises that Walter H. Johnson, Jr., from Placer County, has been appointed to fill Mr. Bequette's position in Shasta County. The exact date of transfer has not been determined. Motion is made by Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Wagoner, and carried, that a letter be sent to Farm Advisor Bequette congratulating him on his new position and expressing the appreciation of the Board of Supervisors for the fine job he has done for Shasta County.

## CENTRAL VALLEY JUSTICE COURT

Letter is read from W. E. and Annie French, owners of the building where the Central Valley Justice Court, Branch County Library and Constable's Offices are located, advising that the rent for this building will be increased from \$148.00 per month to \$200.00 per month, effective May 1, 1962. The Board appoints a committee of the District Attorney, County Executive and Supervisor Tibbitts to study this matter and to make a report and recommendation.

#### WHISKEYTOWN RECREATION AREA: ELECTION

Deputy District Attorney Jere Hurley submits a proposed measure for Shasta County voters to determine whether the Whiskeytown Recreation area should be developed by the Federal Government as a National Recreation Area or by the County with a maximum tax rate of 7¢ per \$100.00 of assessed valuation. The Board discusses this measure at length and determines that Proposition "A" shall be:

"Shall the County of Shasta undertake to develop a recreation area around Whiskeytown Lake supported by a County-wide increase in the ad valorem property tax rate not to exceed seven (7) cents per hundred dollars of assessed valuation."

By motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Wagoner, and passed by the following vote, the Board of Supervisors orders a Special Election on the above-stated propositions and directs said special election consolidated with the Direct Primary, June 5, 1962:

#### WELFARE

On motion of Supervisor Morgan, seconded by Supervisor Wagoner, and carried, Welfare Cases are approved as presented by Marian Babiarz, Welfare Director (see Welfare Minutes).

#### GENERAL ASSISTANCE: MEMBERS OF LABORER'S UNION

Welfare Director Marian Babiarz reports she received a request from Raymond Trisdale, President of the local Laborer's Union, requesting General Assistance from Shasta County for members of the Laborer's Union; however, he requested the County to waive the requirement to be certified for the County's Work Program. Mrs. Babiarz further advises that the Welfare Department interviewed four men from the Laborer's Union on Friday and granted commodities to three on an emergency basis.

#### RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE MEDICAL SELF-HELP TRAINING PROGRAM

Resolution approving and supporting the Medical Self-help Training Program for Shasta County is read. By motion of Supervisor Morgan, seconded by Supervisor Perez, and carried, the Board of Supervisors passes Resolution No. 62-45 declaring their approval and support of the Medical Self-help Training Program as sponsored by the Office of Civil Defense and the United States Health Service. PRIORITY LIST: STATE HIGHWAY PROJECTS CLYDE RANN: REDDING CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

Clyde Rann, representing the Highway Committee of the Redding Chamber of Commerce presents and discusses a list of State Highway Projects and the order of their priority. Members of the Highway Committee of the State Chamber of Commerce will be in Redding June 4, 1962 to further discuss this priority list.

#### DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

#### LIBRARY SITE LEASE: WHITMORE

County Librarian Esther Mardon discusses the need for additional space and services at the Branch Library at Whitmore. The present Branch Library is located in a building 8' x 10' on land with a short-term lease, permitting a very limited use. Chief Building Inspector Richard Fox reports that the residents of Whitmore have offered to furnish a Branch Library and equip the kitchen in exchange for use of the building for meetings when the Library was not open. The Whitmore Union School District has offered a 25 year lease for a portion of the school property and to provide water at a cost of 25% of the total cost of any major repairs to main water system or pump. Electricity would also be available. (Dept. of Public Works, Library Site Lease: Whitmore, Continued)

The Board of Supervisors discuss this matter at length, and on motion of Supervisor Wagoner, seconded by Supervisor Keefer, and carried, the Department of Public Works is authorized to negotiate a lease with the school district for land for library purposes.

### KAYDEE SUBDIVISION: STREET ACCEPTANCE

Director of Public Works Donald D. Chamberlin reports that the streets in the Kaydee Subdivision have been constructed according to specifications and recommends that the Board accept these streets into the County Road System. By motion of Supervisor Morgan, seconded by Supervisor Wagoner, and carried, the Board of Supervisors accepts into the County Road System the following streets:

Alma Avenue: from Harpole Road southerly to end (a cul-de-sac street)

De Moll Drive: from non-county road N3H14 to Alma Avenue, 115 ft.

#### KAYDEE SUBDIVISION: PROGRESS PAYMENTS

By motion of Supervisor Keefer, seconded by Supervisor Perez, and carried, the Board of Supervisors authorizes Director of Public Works Donald D. Chamberlin to issue progress payment to A. Teichert and Sons for construction of improvements in the Kaydee Subdivision.

# LEASE: STORAGE OF BLASTING POWDER

Director of Public Works Donald D. Chamberlin advises that adequate storage for the County's blasting powder is needed. The Pacific Gas & Electric Company has contacted the Department of Public Works with a similar problem. Mr. Chamberlin suggests that the County and the Pacific Gas & Electric Company negotiate with the City of Redding to lease appropriate land near the Benton Airport on which each (the County and Pacific Gas & Electric Company) could build a security type storage for blasting powder. On motion of Supervisor Keefer, seconded by Supervisor Morgan, and carried, the Board of Supervisors authorizes Director of Public Works Donald D. Chamberlin to negotiate for lease of City of Redding property, as above described, for storage of blasting powder.

#### INTER-MOUNTAIN FAIR: BUDGET TRANSFER

George Ingram, Manager, Inter-Mountain Fair presents a request for a budget transfer for the Inter-Mountain Fair, to cover the cost of replacing 15 fire extinguishers which were frozen and a salary increase from \$584.00 to \$619.00 per month for the Fair Manager as approved by the State to be effective May 1, 1962. By motion of Supervisor Wagoner, seconded by Supervisor Morgan, and carried, the Board of Supervisors approves the budget transfer and authorizes Chairman Tibbitts to sign on behalf of Shasta County.

# PROPOSED PEDDLER'S ORDINANCE

This is the time set for further discussion of the proposed Peddler's Ordinance. Affidavit of Publication of Notice of Hearing is on file. The Clerk reads the proposed Ordinance. Letters are read from the Hat Creek Farm Center, Fall River-Big Valley Cattlemen's Association and Shasta Pomona Grange No. 13, in favor of the proposed Ordinance. Letter from the McArthur Farm Center opposing the Ordinance is read.

Jean Pritchard, Avon Representative, Mrs. Sanders, McNess Products Representative, Lee Berry, Knapp Shoes Representative, and Ray Kick, Raleigh Products Representative ask questions regarding the effect of the proposed Peddler's Ordinance on their type of soliciting and the employment of salesmen for their products. District Attorney Richard Abbe and the Board of Supervisors answer these questions.

District Attorney Richard Abbe is requested to revise Section 4(3) so that it is the individual that must be a resident of Shasta County 90 days instead of the business. District Attorney Abbe is further requested to revise this proposed Ordinance to include a paragraph to cover those persons that conduct temporary auctions. The Chairman declares the hearing closed to the public and directs the matter of the revised Peddler's Ordinance put on the Board's Agenda for 10:30 a.m., May 21, 1962.

#### RAYMOND TRISDALE: LABORER'S UNION: SURPLUS COMMODITIES

A number of members of the Laborer's Union are present. Raymond Trisdale, President of the Laborer's Union, urges the Board of Supervisors to take immediate action to, 1) alleviate unemployment in Shasta County, and 2) to provide commodities to unemployed persons; however, he requests the Board to waive the County's requirement that employable persons must be certified and work on the County's Work Program for any commodities they receive. Mr. Trisdale states that persons listed on the Labor Union's Board must be available to accept a job should one become available. The Board of Supervisors advises that the County urges those persons working for the County's Work Program to seek other employment and arranges their hours of work so that they may do so and should anyone working on the County's Work Program receive a call to go to private employment, he would be immediately released.

Frank Myers presents a letter from Paul D. Ward, Legislative Counsel, Governor's Office regarding commodities for unemployed persons.

#### TENTATIVE SUBDIVISION MAPS

Letter is read from the Planning Commission advising that Tentative Maps of the following subdivision were approved with certain conditions at the Planning Commission Meeting of May 10, 1962:

Harley Layton, from the office of Adams and Reiser, inquires whether or not the Board of Supervisors will approve a Final Map of the Fall Creek Subdivision with private roads. The Board of Supervisors will render a decision on this matter at 3:30 p.m., May 28, 1962.

Bob Chatfield, from the office of Clair A. Hill, Engineers, states that he planned to appeal the action of the Planning Commission with regard to the Planning Commission requirement for approval of tentative map of the Ladera Subdivision, but would do so at a later date.

During the lunch recess today, members of the Board of Supervisors inspected the Palo Cedro Acres Subdivision. #### USE PERMIT APPEAL: CURTIS JENNINGS

This is the time set for the public hearing on the Appeal of Curtis and Mary Jennings from the Planning Commission's denial of a Use Permit to construct two houses on his property. The Clerk reports that notice of hearing was mailed to all property owners within a 300 ft. radius of the Jennings property. A number of interested persons are present. Planning Director James Herbert reviews proceedings to date. Chairman Tibbitts turns the gavel over to Vice-Chairman Morgan.

Supervisor Tibbitts suggests that possibly the Board of Supervisors would consider granting a conditional Use Permit whereby Mr. Jennings would be required to surface 100 feet in front of each house, thereby controlling, to a degree, the dust and/or mud problem. This matter is discussed at length and Deputy District Attorney Jere Hurley is called to the Board Room for an opinion as to whether or not the Board of Supervisors may grant a conditional Use Permit. Mr. Hurley advises that the denial of a second Use Permit by the Planning Commission was a policy matter and is legal and that the Board of Supervisors may overrule the Planning Commission and grant a Use Permit either with or without specific conditions.

Glenn Rodgers, Manager, Buckeye Water District, Carl Andersen, Mr. Garrett, Mrs. Chaney, and Mrs. Ballou state that they feel that Mr. Jennings should be allowed to build his houses as proposed.

Frank Shuman, Attorney for Curtis Jennings requests the Board of Supervisors to rescind their action of June 11th granting a conditional Use Permit to Curtis Jennings and to grant Mr. Jennings an unconditional Use Permit to build two houses on his property. Mr. Shuman states that he feels the Board of Supervisors acted arbitrarily and that the Courts would so find. Mr. Shuman further states that the Board of Supervisors is trying to control "lot splitting" through the Zoning Ordinance instead of a "lot split" ordinance.

Deputy District Attorney Jere Hurley states that he believes that the Zoning Ordinance authorizes the Board of Supervisors to grant conditional Use Permits and that the Board did not act arbitrarily in granting Curtis Jennings a conditional Use Permit requiring him to pave one hundred feet of road in front of each of two houses to be built off of a County road.

Glenn Rodgers, representing the Buckeye Water District speaks strongly against the conditions imposed in granting Curtis Jennings a Use Permit. Mr. Rodgers states that he feels that progress toward improving the Buckeye area has been hurt by the Board of Supervisors' action in this matter. Mr. Rodgers states that he would support a "lot split" ordinance.

Jim Taylor speaks in opposition to the conditions imposed in granting a Use Permit to Curtis Jennings. Ed Clendenin states that the area would possibly be better off without zoning --- since it is requirements of the Zoning Ordinance which are requiring anyone wishing to build a house to first secure a Use Permit.

Following much discussion, motion is made by Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Morgan, and passed by the following vote, that the Board of Supervisors request the Planning Commission to study an amendment to Zoning Ordinance No. 378 with the suggestion that Paragraph 2 of Section 31D be deleted:

#### BOUNDARY CHANGE CEDAR CREEK AND MONTGOMERY CREEK SCHOOL DISTRICTS

This is the time set for the Board of Supervisors to render their decision regarding whether or not to hold a public hearing or call an election on the petition for a boundary change between the Cedar Creek and Montgomery Creek School Districts. Lucy Hunt, Superintendent of Schools, Homer Edgecomb from the Superintendent of Schools Office, and a large group of interested persons from both the Cedar Creek and the Montgomery Creek School Districts are present.

Homer Edgecomb reviews proceedings to date. Mrs. Hunt is requested to make a recommendation as to whether or not a boundary change should be made. Mrs. Hunt states that she does not feel that the Superintendent of Schools' Office should "call policy" for the Board of Supervisors on this matter, especially, in view of the fact that the County Committee on School District Organization must make a recommendation on all the school districts in the County prior to September 1963.

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(Boundary Change: Cedar Creek and Montgomery Creek School Dist., Cont.)

Rodney Robertson, Attorney from San Francisco, representing a group of tax payers from both the Cedar Creek and the Montgomery Creek School Districts, urges the Board to set this matter for a public hearing. Mr. Robertson points out that only three persons are eligible to vote if this boundary change petition is decided by an election, however there are over 900 registered voters within the two school districts that will be effected by the decision of three voters, who have already signed the petition requesting the boundary change.

W. E. Sigmund, Mrs. Compton, Lloyd Compton, Mr. McGrew, representing sixty workers at the Zamboni Lumber Company, and Mrs. Turner speak in favor of a public hearing on this petition.

George Truman and Mrs. Truman speak in favor of the proposed boundary change stating that they desire to have all of their property within the boundaries of one school district.

After much discussion, motion is made by Supervisor Wagoner, seconded by Supervisor Perez, and carried, that the Board of Supervisors hold a public hearing at 2:00 p.m., July 30, 1962, on the petition for a boundary change between the Cedar Creek and the Montgomery Creek School Districts.

#### SALARY SURVEY

Approximately two hundred employees and interested persons are present for the discussion of the Personnel Officer's July 2nd Salary Survey. The Board of Supervisors' Boom being too small for the large number of persons present, the Board transfers the meeting to the Moose Hall.

County Personnel Officer Harold Higgins reviews the method used in preparing his Salary Survey presented to the Board of Supervisors on July 2nd., which recommended a 5% increase for approximately 84% of the County employees, a 10% increase for 5% of the employees and no increase for approximately 11% of the employees. Mr. Higgins now recommends that, should the Board of Supervisors find in favor the recommended salary increase for 89% of the employees, that the remaining employees also, be granted a 5% increase with the exception of certain medical classes which were just recently reclassified.

County Assessor Robert O. McMillen speaks in favor of a salary increase for members of his appraisal staff, who were not recommended for a salary increase in the July 2nd survey. Les Moody speaks on behalf of the appraisers.

District Attorney Richard Abbe speaks in favor of a two range increase for the Chief Deputy District Attorney and the Elections Clerk in his office, instead of the one range increase recommended by the Personnel Officer.

Sheriff John Balma urges the Board of Supervisors to consider a 10% salary increase for his deputies and presents several statistical reports to support his request. Sheriff Balma presents petitions containing 2000 or more signatures of residents of Shasta County supporting a 10% increase for Deputy Sheriffs. Letters from the following are noted as having been received relative to the requested increase for Deputy Sheriffs: Trinity Logging Co., Redding Veneer & Box Co., Frank F. Myers, Construction Local 961, City of Anderson Police Department, Frank and Betty Stover, Burney Veterans of Foreign Wars, Fall Biver Valley Chamber of Commerce, a group of 10 citizens from Burney (Walter Vaughn, Rex Vaughn, Vic Mickey, Dr. J. F. Churney, Dr. W. L. Howlett, John Ospital, John Meeker, Myron Hawkins, W. C. Hilliard, I. M. Morgan) Five Counties Central Labor Council. A. A. Brown, And F. W. Callison. The Clerk reports that prior to leaving the Board of Supervisors' Room earlier this evening that a telephone message was received from the Forward Buckeye-Summit City Club advising that they passed a Resolution supporting a 10% salary increase for Deputy Sheriffs. Carl Erickson, James Elliot, Bichard Abbe, and others speak in favor of a 10% increase for the deputies. Arch Merrifield, representing the Five Counties Central Labor Council, urges the Board to consider a 10% salary increase plus a \$100.00 per year uniform allowance for the deputies.

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Jack Connelly, Hospital Administrator, urges the Board of Supervisors to grant salary increases to those Hospital employees who were omitted from Mr. Higgin's July 2nd recommendation. Mrs. Geneva Pearson and Mrs. Fern Hartsell speak in favor of raises for Hospital employees.

Albert Albaugh, representing the Fall Piver - Big Valley Cattlemen's Association, speaks in opposition to the proposed salary increase for County employees and presents statistics to support his views. Roy Ballou, Walter Aldridge, and Thomas Plotts creak in opposition to the proposed salary increase for County employees.

Joseph Aleck, Judge, Redding Judicial District, speaks in favor of a salary increase for his department.

Charles J. Gleeson, representing the Shasta County Employees Association requests a 10% across the board increase for all County employees.

Letters are read from Constables Alvarez, Green and McFarland submitting their Permits from the California Highway Patrol for a siren and requesting that the Board of Supervisors allow sufficient funds in their budgets to purchase a siren. Supervisor Tibbitts submits a photo copy of Constable Fernandez's permit. After much discussion, motion is made by Supervisor Morgan, seconded by Supervisor Keefer, and passed by the following vote, the Board of Supervisors authorizes the purchase of five sirens as above requested:

The Board of Supervisors approves the recommendation of the Personnel Officer as above outlined.

Constable No. 1 (Redding Judicial District)

The Personnel Officer recommends the one-half time position of Steno-Clerk I in the Redding Constable's Office be increased to 3/4 time. Said increase is approved by the Board.

Superintendent of Schools

County Executive Bill Minton advises that in past years the County has been required to provide funds for two positions of Clerks in the Superintendent of Schools Office, however, this year new legislation requires the County to provide for three positions of Clerk.

a. Definition of a public street:

Robert Hill and Jim Taylor speak in favor of the definition of a public street remaining as is in the Zoning Ordinance. After general discussion, motion is made by Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Morgan, and carried, that no change be made in the definition of a public street.

> b. Establish uniform front, side and rear yard requirements in all "B" Building Site Districts:

Mr. Herbert explains that this amendment is to establish uniform front, side and rear yard set back requirements through-out the Zoning Ordinance. At present various zoned areas have different requirements. By motion of Supervisor Morgan, seconded by Supervisor Perez, and carried, the Board approves the recommendation of the Planning Commission and establishes uniform front, side and rear yard set back requirements.

c. Section 31 d (2)

Section 31 d (2) requires that a Use Permit be obtained prior to a house being constructed in a zoned area when said house will not have its principal frontage on a County Road. The Planning Commission's recommendation that this Section be deleted is read. A group of interested persons are present. Robert Hill, Contractor, speaks in opposition to the deletion of this Section because it assists the County to control indiscriminate splitting of lots in four or less parcels.

Jim Taylor, Glenn Rodgers, C. W. Erickson, Ed Clendenin and Carl Andersen speak in favor of deletion of this Section because they feel it is hindering development in the outlying areas.

This matter is discussed at length with those present and then the hearing is closed to the public by Chairman Tibbitts. Motion is made by Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Morgan, and passed by the following vote, that the Board of Supervisors enact Ordinance No. 378-116 deleting Section 31 d (2) from the Zoning Ordinance:

## PETITION: OXFORD DRIVE, OAKDALE LANE & OAKDALE COURT

Mrs. Beth Eggett presents a petition signed by thirty-seven residents on Oxford Drive, Oakdale Lane and Oakdale Court, requesting that the County take these streets into the County Road System because, periodically these roads which are private roads are closed off with a barricade causing a safety hazard as well as requiring traffic to detour several blocks to get in or out of the area. #### DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

## FEDERAL AID SECONDARY ROAD PROJECTS

Director of Public Works Donald D. Chamberlin reports that he has received a telephone call from the Division of Highways inquiring whether or not Shasta County has any projects on F. A. S. roads which could be ready for immediate construction--within three or four weeks, and that he has informed them that there are three bridges totaling \$170,000.00 and that plans and specifications are ready for approximately \$60,000.00 work on Dersch Road. This is part of the \$900,000,000.00 emergency public works bill authorized by Congress.

## ANDERSON CHAMBER OF COMMERCE: RAILROAD OVERPASS

This is the time set for continued discussion of a proposed overpass near Anderson on the Deschutes Road. A large group of interested persons are present. Traffic counts made during the past week on the Deschutes, Balls Ferry, Locust Roads and Barney Street are presented by the Department of Public Works. Letters are read from the Anderson Fire Department and the International Woodworkers Union supporting an overpass on Deschutes Road.

Bob Yanger, representing the Anderson City Council advises that the Anderson City Council, at a special meeting last week, approved the proposed overpass and indicated they will participate on the basis of comparable assessed valuation--estimated figure of participation is \$2,000 - \$4,000. William Fieweger, representing the Ralph L. Smith Lumber Company, a division of the Kimberly-Clark Corp., advises that they will give the necessary rights of way for this project. Jack Darley, President, and W. T. Jeffs, Road Committee Chairman of the Anderson Chamber of Commerce, speak in favor of the proposed railroad overpass.

A petition containing 381 signatures, presented to the Board of Supervisors on April 4, 1960 requesting a road constructed east of Anderson to give access to the area without having to cross the railroad tracks, is read.

The Board discusses, at length, what County funds would be used for the County's share of the participating funds for this project. It is determined that, at the time County funds are allocated for this project, the Board of Supervisors will review, thoroughly, the road budget with particular emphasis on funds budgeted for roads in Supervisorial District 5.

Motion is made by Supervisor Morgan, seconded by Supervisor Keefer, and passed by the following vote, that the Board of Supervisors approves the project as discussed and outlined on displayed schematic plans and authorizes the Director of Public Works to make application to the Public Utilities Commission for inclusion in the sixth annual list of the Public Utilities Commission (pursuant to Streets and Highways Code, Section 189) establishing a priority of those railroad crossings most urgently in need of separation, for receipt of participating funds for this project:

This is the time set for further review of the Report of the Private Roads Study Committee:

Item No. 1:

After discussion of the recommendations of the Committee regarding the inclusion of the words "Private Roads" in the title of a Subdivision, motion is made by Supervisor Wagoner, seconded by Supervisor Morgan, and carried, that the Planning Director is directed to request the District Attorney to prepare an amendment to the Subdivision Ordinance to provide for the inclusion of the words "Private Road" in the title of a Subdivision until such time as the roads within the Subdivision are taken into the County Road System.

Item No. 2:

By motion of Supervisor Keefer, seconded by Supervisor Morgan, and carried, the Board of Supervisors approves the recommendation that all private roads be posted with a sign "Private Road."

Item No. 3:

The Board discusses the proposed Point System to determine the type of street improvements to be required in various types of subdivisions. Hank Clark, Department of Public Works, reviews various subdivisions throughout the County and the type of road improvements each has as compared with the type of road improvements each would be required to have to meet the requirements of the Point System. The majority of subdivisions already in existence have the type of roads which would be required by the Point System. By motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Wagoner, and carried, the Board of Supervisors adopts the Point System as recommended by the Study Committee.

Item No. 4:

By motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Morgan, and carried, the Board of Supervisors enacts Ordinance No. 422-26 reclassifying one position of Dispatcher Clerk in the Sheriff's Office to Sheriff's Stenographer at Range 17. ## HOSPITAL: RECLASSIFICATION ORDINANCE NO. 422-26

Personnel Officer Harold Higgins recommends that the position of Kitchen Manager, Range 21 at the County Hospital be reclassified to Range 22 (\$415 - \$505) and further recommends that Henry Jorgensen be employed at Step 3 of Range 22 because of his experience in the management of hospital food services. This is the time set for discussion of Dan Elliott's request that the Board of Supervisors grant a public hearing on the issuance of a Garbage Permit and/or revoke the permit issued to LaMar McGram for the Burney area. The request of Dan Elliott is read as well as the reply to the request prepared by Director of Public Works Donald D. Chamberlin.

Frank Shuman, Attorney for Dan Elliott, urges that the Board grant a hearing on this matter. Mr. Shuman states that it is not possible for two garbage collectors to operate in the Burney area and make a fair profit. Mr. Shuman points out that the territory assigned LaMar McGram on Permit #8 is considerably less than that called for in Mr. Elliott's Permit #4. Dan Elliott's Permit calls for serving the Burney area as well as the Fall River Mills and McArthur areas, which are very long hauls that show little or no profit. Mr. Shuman suggests that both permits should be for the same area so that both men would be obligated to serve the areas requiring a long haul and that show little or no profit. Mr. Shuman further states that he feels that the Ordinance should be amended so that there is a requirement that a permit holder within an area in which a new permit is being considered is notified of the new permit.

Dan Elliott advises that he has operated a garbage truck in the Burney area and the Fall River Mills, McArthur and Adin areas since 1957; however, the bulk of his business is the Burney area and he feels that two garbage collectors cannot profitably operate in this area.

LaMar McGram states that he has purchased Mr. Winslow's business which has been in operation since 1957 and for sale for the past 18 months. Mr. McGram states he would be willing to apply for a permit for the Fall River Mills-McArthur areas if his services were needed in that area. Mr. McGram submits a petition containing 70 signatures representing approximately  $\frac{1}{2}$  of his customers.

Deputy District Attorney Jere Hurley states that Ordinance No. 383 is to control the type of truck and that a safe place is used to dispose of the garbage and is not for the purpose of granting an exclusive franchise. The appeal provided for in the Ordinance is in regard to the equipment or place of disposal. (Dan Elliott: Garbage Permit No. 8, Continued)

## REPORT: NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RELINQUISH FRONTAGE ROAD: HIGHWAY 99 SOUTH

Chamberlin reports that he and Supervisor Keefer inspected the portions of frontage road adjacent to Highway 99 South which the State has notified of its intention to relinquish to Shasta County. The shoulders along this frontage road need an oil penetration treatment and this matter has been called to the attention of District Engineer H. S. Miles, who has agreed to the oil penetration treatment along the shoulders of the aforesaid frontage road.

## REPORT: FALL-OUT SHELTERS IN SHASTA COUNTY

Assistant Director of Public Works James W. Huston reports that his investigation of facilities in Shasta County which would provide protection in the event of a nuclear attack has revealed approximately 9300 shelter spaces of which only 5100 spaces could be used without extensive remodeling and there are 65,000 persons in Shasta County.

Mr. Huston estimates the cost to Shasta County for a minimum type fall-out shelter to be at least \$50.00 per shelter space; the federal government estimates the cost at \$70.00 per space and the City of Livermore estimates the cost to be \$120.00 per space. Approximately 1500 of the potential spaces in Shasta County are located east of Redding, approximately 70 miles, in the lava beds.

Civil Defense Coordinator Tom Gaines states that he believes there are possibly 8,000 more spaces available in the lava tubes in eastern Shasta County and requests authorization to proceed with making at least one cave habitable. #### BIT, INCORPORATED: EQUIPMENT DEMONSTRATION

The Board of Supervisors directs County Executive Bill Minton to invite representatives of Bit, Incorporated to demonstrate their electronic data processing equipment to Shasta County Officials at 1:00 p.m. December 18, 1962 in the Board of Supervisors' Chambers.

#### HEARING: ARVILLE PERDUE APPEAL

This is the time set for hearing the appeal of Arville Perdue from the Department of Welfare's denial of his application for OASDI. District Attorney Abbe, representing Shasta County, Welfare Director Marian Babiarz, Assistant Welfare Director Merle Morrison, Arville Perdue and his attorney Alvin Cibula, and Deputy Sheriff Don Brickey are present.

Attorney Alvin Cibula presents history of the previous appeals of Mr. Perdue; the Superior Court Ruling of Judge Ross; information that Mr. Perdue received OASDI for the period April 1961 through June 30, 1962 at which time the Welfare Department declared him ineligible to receive further OASDI assistance. Mr. Cibula advises that the reason the Welfare Department discontinued OASDI payments and denied other applications for OASDI is that Mr. Perdue owns a  $\frac{1}{2}$  interest in a Second Deed of Trust which the Welfare values at more than \$1200.00. Mr. Cibula states that he does not believe that this  $\frac{1}{2}$  interest in a Second Deed of Trust is worth \$1200.00 and bases his claim on the fact that Mr. Perdue has been willing to sell the aforesaid  $\frac{1}{2}$  interest for over three years and has been unable to do so. Mr. Perdue is 86 years old; he receives \$25.00 per month payments from this Second Deed of Trust and is willing for the Welfare Department to deduct this income from the OASDI grant.

District Attorney Abbe advises that the Welfare Department based their value on the  $\frac{1}{2}$  interest in the Second Deed of Trust on an average of a number of appraisals which the Welfare Department obtained from Realtors and Investment Brokers in the Redding area.

After hearing Attorney Cibula, District Attorney Abbe, and much discussion, the Board of Supervisors closes the hearing and sets the matter on the Board Agenda for 2:30 p.m. December 17, 1962 for decision.

## ARTHUR COGGINS: SUBDIVISION IN KESWICK

Arthur Coggins calls the Board's attention to the improper development of a subdivision in the town of Keswick. This subdivision was approved in the late 1890's and therefore present day subdivision requirements were not provided for -- such as adequate drainage, road right of way, size of lots and etc. An investment company apparently is in the process of purchasing all the lots in this subdivision -punching through bare minimum roads with little or no drainage facilities. After much discussion, Supervisor Perez will look into this matter and keep the Board of Supervisors informed.
