Chamberlin discusses with the Board of Supervisors the problem of whether boundary lines of property proposed for annexation to the City of Redding should follow the center line of a road so that two public agencies are jointly responsible for road maintenance or whether the boundary line should include or exclude a road to insure that only one public agency is responsible for road maintenance. Mr. Chamberlin suggests that the Local Agency Formation Commission adopt a policy for governing boundary lines.

TENTATIVE MAP: SHASTA SHORES SUBDIVISION

This is the time to which the discussion of the tentative map of Shasta Shores Subdivision was postponed. Planning Director James Herbert reads the minutes of the July 8, 1965, Planning Commission meeting approving the tentative map and setting forth conditions for approval. The Board discusses availability of water, fire protection, construction of roads, septic tanks, lot size, and an access road to the subdivision. Motion is made to reject the tentative map because it designates 800 lots and the subdivider states there will probably be a maximum of 400 lots, which would require a revised map. Motion is lost for lack of a second. Director of Public Works Donald D. Chamberlin states that the nearest County Road to be used for access is inadequate for the traffic that will be created by 400 lots in the subdivision. After further discussion, by motion made, seconded and carried, and with the consent of the subdivider, the Board of Supervisors sets August 31, 1965, at 10:00 a.m. as the time for a workshop session with the subdivider, engineer, Director of Public Works, Planning Director, State Forest Service, and Health Department representatives in attendance, to resolve the problems in connection with the tentative map of Shasta Shores Subdivision.

BIT INCORPORATED: DATA PROCESSING

John Gullman, President, and Mrs. Berniece Fiester, Executive Secretary-Treasurer, of Bit Incorporated, advise there are corrections to be made in the records that were sent to the company for data processing.
