USE PERMIT APPEAL: SEWAGE LAGOONS SUMMIT CITY PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT RESOLUTION NO. 66-108

This is the time set to hear the appeal of the County Department of Public Works, from the Planning Commission's decision to grant a use permit to the Summit City Public Utility District for sewage lagoons in the SE4 of Section 35, T.33 N., R.5 W. Director of Public Works Donald D. Chamberlin reviews the history of the County's use of the property for the Buckeye Waste Disposal Area and advises that the County has been unable to relocate the dumpground, that a cut and fill operation is scheduled to begin this fiscal year, and that this location has the capacity for a landfill operation through the year 1985. Mr. Chamberlin suggests cooperation between agencies in the use of the entire 160 acre parcel, after feasibility studies are completed. Grant Engstrom, engineer for the District, advises that this site was selected to conform with the sewer study prepared previously by Clair A. Hill and Associates, that an application for a planning grant has been submitted to the H.H.F.A., engineering studies will begin after receipt of the grant, and that the District applied for the use permit to seek assurance of the availability of the land. Don Hill, Secretary-Manager of the District, Donna Lawton, Della Moore, Mrs. Bradshaw and other interested residents within the District are present and discuss the use permit and the District's and the County's applications to the Bureau of Land Management for release of the public domain lands. George Nielsen, representing the Bureau of Land Management, advises that if the Board of Supervisors submits a recommendation the Bureau would hold the District's application in abeyance pending further studies and negotiations. Supervisor Perez states he had recommended that the District withdraw its application so the Board would not be forced to deny the use permit, but the application was not withdrawn, and today is the deadline for a decision. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors denies the use permit to Summit City Public Utilities District for sewage lagoons in the SE4 of Section 35.

By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors adopts Resolution No. 66-108 stating its intention to work with Summit City Public Utility District to develop a plan for the cooperative use of the land in the vicinity of the Buckeye Waste Disposal Area, for both dump and sewage disposal purposes.

By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors approves the agreement with the City of Redding and Ron Farley for temporary water service and authorizes Chairman Keefer to sign on behalf of Shasta County.

RIDGE ROAD IMPROVEMENT

Dr. Buel also proposed that the Sanatorium be authorized to accept chronic patients that represent an overload from Mercy and Memorial Hospitals, to provide income until the chest disease treatment becomes established. The Board discusses the proposed conversion of Shasta County Hospital to a General Hospital and that the Sanatorium would be in direct competition with the County Hospital facility. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors states its position that under the present arrangement the Cascade Sanatorium should be operated only as a tuberculosis hospital.

SUPERVISOR WAGONER: MAYERS MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

Supervisor Wagoner advises he and County Executive Bill Minton have located a hospital consultant, August W. Koenig, who will prepare a study of Mayers Memorial Hospital, as authorized by the Board October 17th, at a cost of \$1,800.00. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors approves the hiring of the hospital consultant, authorizes County Counsel to prepare a contract and authorizes Chairman Keefer to sign the contract for consultant services for Mayers Memorial Hospital.

PUBLICATION OF PROCEEDINGS

By motion duly seconded and carried, the Clerk is hereby directed and authorized to publish a fair statement of the proceedings of the Board of Supervisors' meeting held October 31, 1966, in the Anderson Valley News.

ORIENTATION INDUCTION TRAINING PROGRAM

Letter is read from Newton R. Holcomb, Director of the State Department of Welfare, in reply to the County's request to delay the State Orientation Induction Training Program for newly employed social workers until the County can recruit an employee as Staff Development Supervisor for a local program, advising that induction training must be completed within the first two months of employment and that a county welfare department can establish its own program prior to employment of a Staff Development Supervisor. Such a program must be under the direction of and taught by a staff member who is qualified with a Master of Social Work degree, and the plan must be submitted to the State for prior approval. Welfare Director Marian Babiarz advises there are two staff members so qualified, and another qualified person who might be interested in part time employment. The Board of Supervisors authorizes Mrs. Babiarz to explore the possibility of establishing a local Orientation Induction Training Program.

DESIGNATION OF BUSINESS ROUTE 5 ANDERSON TO REDDING: SIGNS

Gordon Chester, representing Herb Miles, District Engineer of the State Division of Highways, discusses the opening of Interstate 5 from Anderson to Redding, that Highway 99 will be designated as Business Route 5, and sketches the proposed placement of a sign on the freeway south of Anderson directing northbound traffic to the area known as South Redding, because that exit is the only access to businesses in the area between Clear Creek and Cypress Avenue. Supervisor Morgan requests that people in the City of Anderson be given an opportunity to express an opinion on the placement of such a sign because of their interest in the business development immediately north of Anderson, and invites Mr. Chester to attend a meeting of the Anderson Chamber of Commerce at noon today to discuss the proposed sign. SHASTA GENERAL HOSPITAL MEDICAL STAFF BY-LAWS JOINT CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

On recommendation of Hospital Administrator Jack Connelly and by motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors adopts the Shasta General Hospital Medical Staff By-Laws as submitted, and authorizes Chairman Keefer to sign; and appoints Supervisor Perez and Supervisor Wagoner to meet with two members of the Executive Committee, the Medical Director, Hospital Administrator, and County Executive Officer, as the Joint Conference Committee.

SHASTA GENERAL HOSPITAL PATIENT SERVICES RATES

The schedule must be submitted to the State Department of Social Welfare for approval also.
