By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors accepts the check in the amount of \$1,600.00 and directs County Auditor Mildred Prehn to deposit the premium in the Advertising Fund.

PINE GROVE MOSQUITO ABATEMENT DISTRICT RESIGNATION AND APPOINTMENT OF TRUSTEES

Supervisor Wagoner submits a letter he received from Leo F. Arnold, resigning as a trustee of the Pine Grove Mosquito Abatement District. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors accepts the resignation with regret and authorizes Chairman Tibbitts to sign a letter of appreciation to Mr. Arnold. Letter is received from the Pine Grove Mosquito Abatement District Trustees, recommending that Bill Christensen be appointed to replace Leo Arnold, and recommending the reappointment of Albert Albaugh for a new term of office. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors appoints Bill Christensen and reappoints Albert Albaugh as trustees of the Pine Grove Mosquito Abatement District.

BURNEY: ZONING OF BARTEL STREET

Supervisor Wagoner submits a petition be received from residents of Bartel Street, Burney, advising they had requested R-4 zoning for the area and were surprised to learn that R-R zoning had been approved for the Bryan property at the Supervisors' meeting of August 28th, and advising they did not attend the hearing because of a misunderstanding of the time. The Board of Supervisors directs a copy of the petition to the Planning Department for information.

12:00 Noon: The Board of Supervisors recesses until 2:00 p.m.

2:00 p.m.: The Board of Supervisors reconvenes in regular session with all members present.

<u>DECISION: FORMATION OF</u> MAYERS MEMORIAL HOSPITAL DISTRICT

This is the time set for decision on the formation of Mayers Memorial Hospital District. County Clerk Richard C. Brennan displays a map indicating those properties requesting exclusion from the District, representing \$3,137,916.00 assessed valuation in Shasta County and \$83,803.00 assessed valuation in Lassen County, and that the total assessed valuation in the proposed District is \$31,925,271.00. Supervisor Wagoner advises that a drive for pledges to support the hospital has been started. Irv Toler advises he has received signed pledges in the amount of \$11,535.00 for the first year and more time is needed to receive responses to the requests. Ed Bruce and Mrs. Cruikshank, Hospital Directors, advise they would prefer an election to set a five to seven cent tax rate, and that the hospital would need \$15,000.00 the first year and \$17,000.00 the second year of operation, if the pledges were only for a two year period. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors sets 2:00 p.m. September 18, 1967, for decision on the formation of Mayers Memorial Hospital District, to allow time for Irv Toler, Chairman of the Taxpayers Committee, to obtain pledges for a two year period that would total the amount needed to support the hospital.

<u>HEARING: VARIANCE APPEAL</u> <u>W. JAXON BAKER</u>

This is the time set to hear the appeal of residents of the area from the Planning Commission's decision to recommend granting a variance to W. Jaxon Baker to allow crushing and removal of rock from the Dr. Charles Miller property located approximately 500' north of Old Forty-Four Drive on the east side of Stillwater Creek. Planning Director James Herbert reads the resolution of the Planning Commission setting forth hours of operation, site of the plant, requirement that the access road be oiled, that the County Road be kept clear of spillage, and that the variance will be effective for a period of 90 working days. Don Linton, representing Verl and Betty Jones, Al Mattson, Mr. Hite, Jack Brim, Mrs. Dennler, Mary Fortna, and Mrs. Jones speak in opposition to the variance and state they do not want industrial development that would encourage additional industry. Attorney John Spann, representing the applicant, advises his client will not seek to expand or continue operations at this site after the 90 day period. Dr. Miller speaks in favor of the variance. After much discussion, by motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors grants a variance to W. Jaxon Baker for crushing and removal of rock for a period of 90 working days, with the additional conditions that there will be no operation on Sundays or holidays, and that the applicant will widen and improve the access connection at Old Forty-Four Drive.

County Superintendent of Schools Ray Darby discusses Project Head Start, which is part of the Economic Opportunity Act. County Counsel Robert Rehberg advises the County can, at this time, pay out only 1/6 of the budgeted amount allocated to the Poverty Study-Action Association, because the funds are allocated on the basis of matching Federal funds, and if Congress should not approve funds for the Economic Opportunity Act, the members of the Board of Supervisors may be personally liable for replacing any amount over 1/6 of the budgeted amount that is expended. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors approves payment of 1/6 of the funds budgeted, and authorizes the County Auditor to issue a desk warrant in the amount of \$1,571.00 from the Welfare Fund, Economic Opportunity Act, to the Poverty Study-Action Association, as payment for September and October, 1967.

CLEARING OF TORMEY DRAIN

Attorney William Coshow, representing a client, Attorney Jack Halpin, representing himself and other property owners, and Realtor James Westlake, oppose regulations for the Whiskeytown Area, which require a use permit for all uses, require a three acre minimum lot size for all parcels, and prohibit commercial development of any kind. County Counsel Robert Rehberg advises that the regulations provide immunity from acquisition of private lands by the Federal Government. The public hearing is closed. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors enacts Ordinance No. 378-383 amending the Zoning Ordinance to provide for the NRA-S District, for designating boundaries on a Special Zoning Map, and adding Section 17.2, Regulations for the Shasta Unit of the National Recreation Area. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors enacts Ordinance No. 378-384 amending the Zoning Ordinance by adopting the Special Zoning Map of the Shasta Lake Unit of the National Recreation Area. The Board of Supervisors held a public hearing October 9th on the condemnation of the cabins.

Ed Warren, Executive Director of the Community Action Project, introduces eight VISTA trainees who will be in Shasta County for a period of one year.

HEARING: APPEAL OF VARIANCE CITY OF REDDING

This is the time set for hearing the appeal of the City of Redding from the Planning Commission's recommendation to deny a variance to establish an outdoor advertising sign which would be less than 1000 feet from a previously approved sign, located north of Cottonwood on the Auction Yard Property. Letter is read from the City of Redding withdrawing the appeal since the County recently enacted Ordinance No. 378-378 amending the Zoning Ordinance to provide that the Planning Commission can issue use permits for public service signs less than 1000 feet apart.

SUPERVISOR PEREZ: BUILDING COMMITTEE

Supervisor Perez reports that the Building Committee met to discuss the Assessor's request for rearranging partitions in his office to provide more space. The Committee has requested an estimate of expenses involved for adjusting the partitions. The Building Committee also discussed the need for additional office space for the Welfare Department, and the type of financing available for supplying the additional space.

Supervisor Perez reports that Supervisor Wagoner was appointed Chairman of the Public Lands Committee, Supervisor Perez was appointed Chairman of the Resources Committee and Chairman of the Water Committee for the County Supervisors Association of California, and that Supervisor Keefer was appointed Vice-Chairman of the Northern California County Supervisors Association.

HEARING: NAMING STREETS CASCADE BOULEVARD

This is the time set for public hearing to consider the naming of a County road running from Union School Road where it is intersected by Interstate 5 and running southward on the west side of Interstate 5 to the Oasis Road Interchange. Affidavit of Posting Notice of Hearing is on file. Letter is read from the Shasta Dam Area Chamber of Commerce, urging the road be named Cascade Boulevard. Al Coombs and Walt Wilson speak in favor of the name Cascade Boulevard. No one is present to speak against the proposed name. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors names the Interstate 5 frontage road running southward between Union School Road and Oasis Road "Cascade Boulevard".

SUPERVISOR TIBBITTS: REGIONAL PLANNING COUNCILS

Supervisor Tibbitts reports on the meeting he attended at San Francisco last week, which was sponsored by the National Association of Counties and the National League of Cities, to discuss the new planning councils being established all over the country by Housing and Urban Development for the Government. The councils call for inter-agency planning, provide for the establishment of Regional Planning Councils and for Area Planning Councils at the local level, such as the Shasta County and Cities Area Planning Council.

DECISION: ZONING AMENDMENTS WHISKEYTOWN-SHASTA-TRINITY NATIONAL RECREATION AREA ORDINANCE NO. 378-386: ORDINANCE NO. 378-387

This is the time set for the Board of Supervisors to render a decision on the proposed zoning regulations for the Whiskeytown Unit of the Whiskeytown-Shasta-Trinity National Recreation Area. Planning Director James Herbert advises that the Planning Commission held a special meeting November 30th, reconsidered and revised its recommendations for regulations of the Whiskeytown Unit to provide that one acre is adequate for a single family residence without a use permit. Deputy County Counsel Len Wingate corrects the distributed text to provide that three acres is adequate for a single family residence without a use permit, as recommended by the Planning Commission, and reviews the additional proposed changes to regulations submitted last week; permitting residential use for one acre minimum lot size, light commercial use, and signs with limitations, subject to securing a use permit. Arthur Coggins discusses the regulations, Attorney William Coshow, Attorney Laurence Carr, Realtor James Westlake, and property owner Pat Lucas, speak in opposition to zoning of the area. After further discussion, by motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors enacts Ordinance No. 378-386 amending the Zoning Ordinance to provide for the NRA-Wl and NRA-Wll Districts, and adding Section 17.1, Regulations for the Whiskeytown Unit of the National Recreation Area. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors enacts Ordinance No. 378-387 amending the Zoning Ordinance by adopting the Special Zoning Map of the Whiskeytown Unit of the National Recreation Area.
