Attorney Frank Shuman, representing Mr. Rolback, advises that the required size water line to obtain water from the Wonderland-Mountain Gate Community Services District will be installed, states that a mobile home park is compatible with development of the area, and submits a petition containing twenty-seven signatures in favor of the use permit. Jack Bollinger, Kenneth Skinner, and Bill Sandbloom, property owners in the area, speak in favor of the mobile home park. Robert Graham, property owner, speaks against the use permit and states that the development of the area is mainly five acre and two and one-half acre homesites. The Board reminds Mr. Graham there is no zoning in the area at the present time. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors grants a use permit to Joseph Rolback for a thirty-two unit trailer park on Old Oregon Trail, subject to the following conditions:

- Obtaining an adequate water supply from the Wonderland-Mountain Gate Community Services District and other requirements of the Department of Public Health to be met.
- Requirements of Department of Public Works to be met regarding dedication of the necessary right-of-way for future alignment of Old Oregon Trail, and access control to be reviewed.

JUNK YARD AND WRECKING YARD REGULATIONS ZONING AMENDMENT: ORDINANCE NO. 378-433 POLICY: DISPOSAL OF ABANDONED VEHICLES

Planning Director James Herbert submits proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance for the regulation and control of junk yards and wrecking yards as revised by the Junk Yard Ordinance Committee and drafted by County Counsel Robert Rehberg. The revision permits establishment of a junk yard in the "U" District without a use permit with limitations, defines junk yard or wrecking yard, screened junk yard or wrecking yard and provides regulations for areas where such use is permitted. Mr. Herbert also submits a proposed policy formulated by him and Director of Public Works Richard Curry regarding sites for the disposal of abandoned vehicles which would allow a short period for opening the various waste disposal areas and designating the Enterprise, Igo, Burney, and Fall River Mills waste disposal areas for depositing junk metal and automobiles on a permanent basis. Mr. Curry, Wes Alexander of the State Highway Patrol, and Bill Anderson of the U. S. Bureau of Land Management, discuss the proposed amendments and the problems of abandoned automobiles. By

motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors enacts Ordinance No. 378-433 amending the Zoning Ordinance for regulation and control of junk yards and wrecking yards, as submitted.

No waste disposal area shall be open for the acceptance of junk metal unless the Planning Director or the Sheriff have a planned program for the elimination of junk automobiles from the area served by the waste disposal facility.
- (B) Junk metal, including automobiles, may be deposited on a permanent basis in (1) Enterprise waste disposal area, (2) Igo waste disposal area, (3) Burney waste disposal area, and (4) Fall River Mills waste disposal area.

## APPEAL: TENTATIVE MAP HOLIDAY CABIN SITES SUBDIVISION

This is the time set to hear the appeal of R. K. Davis from the Planning Commission's conditions of approval of the Holiday Cabin Sites Subdivision tentative map. Planning Director James Herbert reads the minutes of the Planning Commission setting forth the conditions for approval. Richard K. Davis, subdivider, states there is no objection to zoning Tract #1257 to R-R-B-6 because the intention is to redesign the tract to 6 acre lots, but requests that Tract #1258 be allowed to remain R-R-B-5 because the parcels range from 8 acres to 20 acres and that would allow future owners to divide the lots into smaller parcels if desired. Mr. Davis also protests the condition requiring him to establish there is a probability that water will be found on each lot and available throughout the subdivision, and advises there are two springs on the property. Sanitarian Dale Watson advises the report on ground water in the area is not favorable and that if individuals are allowed to divide lots into smaller parcels there is a possibility of a purchaser not being granted a building permit because the lot would not qualify for a well and sewage system. Mr. Watson suggests the developer would be in a better position to subdivide the lots than would an individual who has purchased a large parcel. After further discussion regarding a more definite indication of a water supply and clear designation of lot lines for parcels that cannot be divided, by motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors upholds the Planning Commission's conditions for approval of the Holiday Cabin Sites Subdivision tentative map and denies the appeal.

## VARIANCE: EMIL TWETEN

On recommendation of the Planning Commission, and by motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors grants a variance to Emil Tweten to create two lots containing less than the one acre minimum lot size located approximately  $1\frac{1}{4}$  miles north of Loomis Corners west of Old Oregon Trail.

Planning Director James Herbert displays maps approved by the U. S. Bureau of Census for furnishing block statistics for the 1970 census at a cost of \$2,825. - Airport Road, a new connecting road being the northerly extension of Airport Road to its junction with Old Oregon Trail.
- Argyle Road, a portion of Airport Road extending southerly from the junction with Hartnell Avenue to the merging with the new connecting road and the new cross connection road.

## POINTS OF HISTORICAL INTEREST

Supervisor Wagoner and Supervisor Perez, the committee appointed to study Points of Historical Interest in Shasta County, submit recommendations as compiled by the Shasta Historical Society. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors approves the following areas to be submitted to the State Historical Landmarks Advisory Committee of the Department of Parks and Recreation for designation as "Points of Historical Interest":

- The Tower House, on Highway 299W across from the turn-off to French Gulch, a lodging house and social center during the mid-1800's.
- McEllroy Military Road Crossing, on Highway 299E south from Yreka, crossing the Pit River a short distance below the present highway bridge, used by the military beginning in 1858.
- Texas Springs, on Texas Springs Road in the Clear Creek area, was a mining town in the 1850's.
- Balls Ferry, on Balls Ferry Road, the site of an early day ferry crossing of the Sacramento River, which was replaced by a steel bridge in 1897.
- Piety Hill, east of Igo, a town that supplied nearby mines, occupied largely by Chinese with truck gardens until the early 1900's.
- Horsetown, Clear Creek Road, located near Reading's Bar where the first gold was discovered in 1848.
- Briggsville, Clear Creek Road, a gold mining settlement of the early 1850's where mortar lime was produced for construction of brick buildings in Horsetown and other nearby towns.
- Shingletown, Highway 44, named because two men made shingles on a creek at this site in the year 1852.
- Afterthought Mine, on Highway 299E 23 miles northeast of Redding, an ore mine that operated for 96 years with the greatest production between 1902 and 1908.
- Millville, on Old Forty-Four Drive, named because of a flour mill that was built near the site in 1855. The town became an important distribution center.

DISCUSSION: PROPOSED ORDINANCE
DISPOSAL OF ABANDONED VEHICLES

At the request of Supervisor Wagoner, Chairman of the Study Committee, County Counsel Robert Rehberg reviews the mechanics of a proposed ordinance for the disposal of abandoned vehicles, which provides for a hearing and removal of automobiles as a public nuisance and designates the Sheriff as the enforcing officer. The Board of Supervisors directs the Committee to continue discussions of the proposed ordinance to submit to the Board at a later date.

## REAPPOINTMENT: MEDICAL STAFF SHASTA GENERAL HOSPITAL

On recommendation of Medical Director Dr. Francis Martin, and by motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors reappoints 68 members of the staff of Shasta General Hospital, effective January 1, 1969.

## DR. GASMAN: MENTAL HEALTH PLAN

Dr. David H. Gasman, Program Chief of Mental Health Services, submits and discusses the proposed Mental Health Plan for Shasta County mental health services under the Lanterman-Petris-Short Act, which will become effective July 1, 1969. The Mental Health Plan consists of a description of the Plan, expansion for more complete care, evaluation of services, and the pattern of care. The Board discusses the salary increases included in the proposed budget and advises it does not approve increases until after the annual salary survey. Dr. Gasman and Dr. Martin recommend that Dr. Gasman be designated as the Director of the Mental Health Program, and that a Conservator be designated in accordance with the Plan. Dr. Gasman requests permission to use budgeted travel funds to bring a candidate for the position of psychologist to Shasta County for interview and the Board advises this is against County policy. The Board of Supervisors directs Dr. Gasman to make corrections to the proposed Mental Health Plan, to be submitted next week for approval.

## CIVIL DEFENSE COCRDINATOR: STORM DAMAGE

Civil Defense Coordinator Henry Woodrum reports that he, Lynn Roberts of the State Civil Defense Office, George Klingelhofer of the Small Business Administration, and Jesse Haws of the Red Cross office, toured the County today to view damage caused by the snowstorm last week, and that Mr. Klingelhofer will return to San Francisco to compile data for determination of possible financial assistance from the Small Business Administration. Telegram is read from Congressman Harold T. "Bizz" Johnson requesting information on the scope of damage, and is referred to Mr. Woodrum for reply. Mr. Woodrum requests an additional budget allocation of \$235 for purchase of citizens band radio equipment to replace the outmoded equipment used during the storm. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors refers the request to County Executive Bill Minton for report and recommendation.
