AIR MONITORING STATION

Health Officer Dr. Ben Hurst and Director of Sanitation Dale Watson advise that the State Air Resources Board proposes to establish an air monitoring station in Redding, that a State instrument technician will operate the station, but the State requests that local government provide a building and utilities, and an employee to be trained to provide assistance in case of an emergency. HEARING: ZONING AMENDMENTS ORDINANCE NO. 378-485: VARIOUS PROPERTIES

This is the time set for public hearing on the proposed zoning of various ranch properties located in northeastern Shasta County. Affidavit of Publication of Notice of hearing is on file. Planning Director James Herbert reads the recommendation of the Planning Commission for the zoning of each property to EA-AP Exclusive Agricultural-Agricultural Preserve, or A-F Agricultural-Forest District. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors takes action as follows, or zones the following properties by the enactment of Ordinance No. 378-485:

W. Leonard & Vanner Bickel Property

Approximately 365 acres, consisting of three parcels, two of which are less than the required 100 acres, zoned EA-AP with recognition given to the use permit granted for the two smaller parcels.

Vincent Meyer Property

Letter from Vincent Meyer is read, requesting Assessor's Parcel No. 16-24-3, containing approximately 160 acres of the 1,031 acres, be zoned A-F instead of EA-AP. Parcel No. 16-24-3 is referred back to the Planning Commission for consideration of A-F zoning, and the balance of the Vincent Meyer property is zoned EA-AP.

John McArthur Property

Approximately 1,152 acres, consisting of one large parcel and two small outlying parcels, zoned EA-AP for the large parcel, and A-F for the two smaller parcels.

Kenneth McArthur Property

Kenneth McArthur is present and requests that one parcel of 120 acres containing a sand pit be excluded from the proposed zoning. Zoning to EA-AP is approved for all parcels with the exception of 120 acres requested be withdrawn and one parcel of 320 acres to be zoned A-F. (Planning Commission Continued)

Floyd Bidwell Property

Letter is read from Floyd Bidwell, requesting that approximately 80 acres known as the Doyle Ranch and approximately 10 acres known as the Long Ranch be excluded from the EA-AP zoning. Zoning to EA-AP is approved for all parcels, excluding the Doyle Ranch and Long Ranch as requested, with recognition of the use permit granted for one parcel containing less than the required 100 acres.

Birdie L. Bidwell Property

Planning Commission recommendation is for EA-AP zoning of the two parcels totaling 705 acres. Jerry Thomason advises that Mr. Wilcox is ill and requests the hearing be continued. Lawrence B. Bosworth Property

Richard E. Norris Property

Zoning to EA-AP is approved, joining together with the Lawrence B. Bosworth Property in one Agricultural Preserve, since the Norris Property does not meet the criteria by itself.

Morris L. Doty Property

Zoning to EA-AP is approved.

Catherine G. Ryan & Elizabeth A. Elmhirst Property

CLASSIFICATION OF PUBLIC LANDS FRENCH GULCH AREA

In response to a letter received December 22nd from the U. S. Bureau of Land Management regarding the classification of public lands near French Gulch, Planning Director James Herbert reads a letter advising that in the Recreation Element of the Mountain Region of the General Plan the site, which is on the East Fork of Clear Creek a mile east of the Trinity Mountain Road, is shown as a "proposed park" of the B.L.M. for camping and picnic purposes, and that the proposed classification would segregate the land from mining claims which could be patented. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Land Conservation Act Committee to consider and submit recommendations on all aspects of the Williamson Act and the Open Space Amendment, and directs the Committee to submit names of persons to be appointed as advisory members.
