MINUTES OF MEETING NOVEMBER 30, 1970

By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors approves the minutes of meeting November 30, 1970, as mailed.

COUNTY CLAIMS

WELFARE

GENERAL ASSISTANCE: DONALD KISSINGER

Welfare Director Marian Babiarz reports that Donald and Sylvia Kissinger have requested general assistance, that Mr. Kissinger has applied to Vocational Rehabilitation for training because he can no longer perform heavy labor, that the medical examination at Shasta General Hospital indicates he is able to do average light work, and since general assistance is for unemployable persons Mrs. Babiarz recommends denial of the request. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors denies general assistance for Donald Kissinger, as recommended.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE: SANDRA KAY MOORE

Welfare Director Marian Babiarz reports that Sandra Kay Moore has again requested general assistance for child care and transportation expenses from Burney while she is attending cosmetology school in Redding, and again recommends denial on the basis that granting general assistance for education would set a precedent, and recommends the request be referred back to the Welfare Department to seek a solution to the problem. By motion made, seconded and carried, the Board of Supervisors denies general assistance to Sandra Kay Moore as recommended, refers the request to the Welfare Department for a determination of possible assistance, and requests that Mrs. Babiarz report back to the Board within approximately two weeks.

FOOD STAMP PROGRAM: ANDERSON

Welfare Director Marian Babiarz reports that the first three days experience in issuing food stamps in the City of Anderson was successful, and that the number of persons reporting for purchase of food stamps at the Welfare Department was reduced so that no one was required to wait outside the building.

FOOD STAMP PROGRAM: CENTRAL VALLEY

Letter is received from the Shasta Dam Area Chamber of Commerce, requesting that services for the issuance of food stamps be established in the Central Valley Area. Supervisor LaPointe and Welfare Director Marian Babiarz advise they had discussed this request and it would not be feasible to attempt to establish a new location until more experience is gained at the Anderson center. The Board of Supervisors refers the request from the Shasta Dam Area Chamber of Commerce to Welfare Director Marian Babiarz for reply.

AFDC PROGRAM: REPORT

Welfare Director Marian Babiarz reports that changes have been proposed in the AFDC Program, and that she attended a meeting last week in Sacramento where the State Welfare Director discussed the proposed changes in the method of computing budgets, the relationships of persons who can be included in the family unit, and method of computing special needs.

NUISANCE ABATEMENT: WIRT PROPERTY, CASTELLA

Supervisor LaPointe reports he telephoned Mr. LaBarge of the Bank of America to request information regarding the granting of an easement for Donald Wirt to install a sewage disposal system on property adjacent to his property in Castella, and was assured that the Bank of America would grant the easement after Mr. Wirt submits a drawing of the property and location of the system. The Board of Supervisors postpones decision on the nuisance abatement of the Wirt property and sets 10:30 a.m. December 21st for further discussion.

CHURN CREEK PROJECT

Director of Water Resources Robert Dietz reports that the Corps of Engineers has received the State's comments on the Churn Creek Project and has found the project to be feasible and economically justified, and that a meeting will be held December 20th with the State Department of Finance to discuss the 1971-72 budget for flood control.

JONES VALLEY LAUNCHING RAMP

PACKERS BAY LAUNCHING RAMP
