The Board of Supervisors of Shasta County convenes on above date pursuant to order of adjournment with the following present: Supervisors O. M. Turner, Chas. Plumb, J.G. Chatham, Andrew T. Jessen and Clerk Ruth A. Presleigh. Absent - Supervisor Al Meeker. Presiding - Chairman Jessen.

BUCKEYE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT

On motion of Supervisor Chatham, seconded by Supervisor Plumb, the following Resolution and Order was passed by unanimous vote:

RESOLUTION AND ORDER DECLARING CERTAIN
TERRITORY FORMED AS THE BUCKEYE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT
AND DECLARING CERTAIN PERSONS ELECTED AS THE FIRST
BOARD OF DIRECTORS THEREOF

WHEREAS, a petition signed by voters within the following described proposed Water District in excess of ten per cent of the number of votes cast in the proposed district for the office of Governor at the general election next prior to the presenting of said petition was filed by said voters was filed with the Board of Supervisors of Shasta County on the 1st day of November, 1950, and said petition prayed that the territory therein described be incorporated into a water district pursuant to the County Water District Law, and

WHEREAS, said proposed district constitutes a portion of the unincorporated territory of Shasta County and has a population in excess of three hundred inhabitants, and WHEREAS, said petition described the boundaries of said proposed district as in this resolution hereinafter described, and

WHEREAS, no municipal corporation, or any portion thereof, is included in the proposed district, and

WHEREAS, the County Clerk of the County of Shasta published a notice of hearing on the said formation petition once a week for at least two weeks in the Redding Record and Searchlight and the Courier Free Press, a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in Shasta County, and

WHEREAS, an affidavit of such publication is on file in the office of said County Clerk and has been presented in evidence at this hearing, and

WHEREAS, said notice contained the following information, to-wit: 1) the text of said petition for formation of said water district; 2) the number of signers of the petition; 3) at least five of the names signed to the petition; 4) the date and time and place of the meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Shasta County at which the petition will be presented and considered; 5) a statement that all persons interested may then appear and be heard, and

WHEREAS, the date set for such hearing was November 17, 1950, at the hour of 2:00 o'clock P.M.; and

WHEREAS, said petition was presented to the said Board of Supervisors and considered by it, and evidence in support thereof was offered and received and no evidence in opposition thereto was offered, and

WHEREAS, said Board of Supervisors did find that said petition for the formation of a water district complied with the County Water District Law as set forth in the Water Code of California and that no changes in the proposed boundaries of said district shall be made, and

WHEREAS, the description of the proposed boundaries of the district as contained in said petition and as finally determined by the said Board of Supervisors was as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the West $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 23, T. 32 N. R. 5 W., M.D.M., which point is the SW corner of said district and running thence Easterly along the mid-section line of Section 23, to the East $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 23, thence west corner of Section 24; thence Easterly on and along the 4 W., to the Southeast corner of Section 19, T. 32 N. That the boundaries of said Buckeye County Water District are as hereinabove set forth and the territory thereof as hereinabove described is hereby declared and ordered to be formed as a County Water District under the County Water District Law as set forth in the Water Code of California, and that the name of said district shall be the Buckeye County Water District;

CHANGES OF PRECINCT BOUNDARIES

Because of the increase of the registration in the City of Redding and vicinity the new precincts are created and precincts are rebounded and redescribed as follows:

Divide Redding Precinct No. 4A down Cypress Street from Market Street to the Sacramento River. Creating one new precinct.

Divide Redding Precinct No. 6 down Gold Street, east from the Airport to Court Street, creating the second new precinct.

Re-number and redescribe all Redding precincts in consecutive numbers, doing away with A. and B. numbers. There will be 17 Redding Precincts, numbered 1 to 17 inclusive.

Divide North Bells Precinct at State Highway No. 99, creating two precincts which will be known as Bells No. 1 and No. 2. Precinct North Bells to be abolished.

Divide South Bells Precinct at State Highway No. 99, creating two precincts which will be known as Bells No. 3 and No. 4. Precinct South Bells to be abolished.
