The minutes of the meeting of December 24th, 1951 are approved and signed by the Chairman.

COUNTY CLAIMS

By motion duly seconded and carried, County Claims #6221 through # 6789 on various funds are passed as presented to the Board of Supervisors.

WELFARE CASES

By motion duly seconded and carried, Welfare Cases are approved as presented by Merle Morrison of the Shasta County Welfare Department.

Mrs. Myrtle Baker from the Shasta County Welfare Department orally reported on the matter of the paternity of the child of Edla Anderson which was previously referred to the District Attorney for investigation. District Attorney Kennedy orally reported that the matter is being investigated by the Sheriff's Office at the request of the District Attorney.

CIVIL DEFENSE

Civil Defense Co-ordinator Al Barr announced that a Civil Defense Registration meeting for school for law enforcement officers in Civil Defense work would be held at 7:00 p.m. January 7th. 1952. at the music room at Shasta College.

LOWTHIAN CHARGE

Mr. J. W. Lowthian orally charges that the District Attorney Laurence J. Kennedy Jr. refused to take action in the matter of issuing a complaint against a person alleged to have beaten Mr. Lowthian. Copy of the letter from G. E. Oaks to Mr. Ed Street is read. District Attorney Kennedy and Sheriff John Balma present their knowledge of the case. Matter is tabled.

Mrs. Nellie White, Trustee of the Shasta School District, requests information regarding the petition to change the boundaries of the Campton and Shasta School Districts set for hearing January 24th, 1952, at 2:00 p. m., stating that she is opposed to any change. Mrs. White is informed that the protest may be presented at the meeting of January 24th either by petition or personally.

The Board adjourns at 12:00 noon until 2:00 p. m. this day.

The Board of Supervisors reconvenes at 2:00 p. m. with all members and the Clerk present.

ELECTION OF NEW CHAIRMAN

Motion is made by Supervisor Turner, seconded by Supervisor Meeker, that Supervisor Jessen be retained as Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for the ensuing year. Vote is taken as follows:

Ayes: Supervisors Turner, Plumb, Meeker, Chatham

Passed: Supervisor Jessen

The motion is declared passed and Mr. Jessen is reappointed as Chairman.

COUNTY PHYSCIAN

On motion of Supervisor Turner, seconded by Supervisor Plumb, Dr. Byrl C. Ritten-house is reappointed to the position of County Physcian, County Health Officer and Medical Superintendent of the Shasta County Hospital.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR COUNTY OFFICERS

On motion of Supervisor Plumb, seconded by Supervisor Turner, resolution is passed granting permission of County officers to leave the state not to exceed the term provided by law.

POLIO PROCLAMATION

On motion of Supervisor Turner, seconded by Supervisor Chatham, and passed by unanimous vote, a Proclamation is issued dedicating the month of January to the fight against polio and to the 1952 March of Dimes drive January 2nd-31st, and urging every resident of Shasta County to join the March of Dimes with unbounded generosity.

BELL VUE ROAD

Petition is read from residents of the Bell Vue Tract near Anderson requesting the Board of Supervisors to reconsider the proposed plan of construction of a road running through said tract. A delegation of twelve residents orally protest the construction of the road as proposed. Deputy County Assessor Marvin Fox reports on the search made by him of records of the Board of Supervisors regarding early maps. The Board of Supervisors agreed to abandon back to the adjacent property owners all land not needed for rights of way purposes. It was agreed that Shasta County would build the fences and would use all possible means to protect stock during construction.

Because of the previous agreement with the Shasta Plywood for the construction of this road, the petition is denied.

AGREEMENT WITH SHASTA PLYWOOD

On motion of Supervisor Plumb, seconded by Supervisor Meeker, County Road Commissioner Ernest D. Breuning is authorized to enter into an agreement with Shasta Plywood for construction of County Road No. 36-E, commonly known as Riverside Avenue in the Bell Vue Trace near Anderson. The engineering work and supervision of construction will be under the jurisdiction of Shasta County through the office of Road Commissioner Breuning, Shasta Plywood to pay all costs of construction and hold the County free from all liability, said agreement to be subject to the approval of the District Attorney.

DEED ACCEPTED

On motion of Supervisor Chatham, seconded by Supervisor Meeker, right of way deed from Mrs. Shirley Black is accepted and order placed of record.

WIRING OF SHASTA COUNTY HOSPITAL

County Road Commissioner Ernest D. Breuning reports that some action should be taken at once regarding the wiring at Shasta County Hospital. Supervisor Turner reports on his investigation of the condition of the wiring. Dr. Rittenhouse and Supervisor Turner are authorized to employ an electrician to regulate the number of appliances so that there would be a safe load. An inventory of all the electrical equipment was ordered taken, with oil heaters to be installed as needed in place of electric heaters now being used. On motion of Supervisor Plumb, seconded by Supervisor Chatham, the bids here to fore submitted and referred to Mr. Breuning are rejected by unanimous vote.

WEED CONTROL

Road Commissioner Breuning is authorized to make use of approximately \$1500.00 in his budget for clearing of ditches of mosquito abatement districts all weeds, etc., men from Agriculture Commissioner Stroup's Department to be used for this work.

BUCKEYE ROAD

On motion of Supervisor Chatham, seconded by Supervisor Meeker, approval is given to the expenditure of approximately \$50,000.00 from the unbudgeted reserve put under special road improvement fund for use in construction of 2.7 miles of road on the Buckeye Road. Road Commissioner Breuning is authorized to advertise for the construction of new road. It was agreed to rebudget the (money next year to repay the unbudgeted reserve in the amount of expendutire.

APPOINTMENT MANTON JOINT CEMETERY BOARD

CLOSED RANGE ORDINANCE

On motion of Supervisor Meeker, seconded by Supervisor Plumb, an Ordinance is enacted declaring that certain teritory known as Johnson Park Subdivision near Burney has ceased to be devoted chiefly to grazing and providing that estray animals may be taken up on uninclosed property in said area (See Ordinance Book 3, Page 156).

ROAD EMPLOYEES REQUEST

Request is read from E. A. Hester on behalf of the Shasta County Road Employees for 10% increase in wages, pay to be given for 8 yearly holidays, 10 days sick leave per year, etc. Memorandum is read from County Road Commissioner Breuning relative to cost to the County if the request is granted; also quoting apinion of Attorney General Howser regarding per dime employees.

On motion of Supervisor Chatham, seconded by Supervisor Meeker, the request is laid over until the end of the fiscal year and the new budget is being considered.

CLAIM OF PEARL RIGDON

Notice of injuries to the person of Pearl Rigdon and claim for damages in the amount of \$2,098.06 is read. The claim is referred to District Attorney Kennedy.

PETITION ROTHERS RIVERSIDE SUBDIVISION STREETS

Petition is read from residents of Rothers Riverside Subdivision requesting the Board of Supervisors to take into the County Road system Irene Street and Henry Street in said subdivision, each Street being approximately 150 feet in length. The petition is referred to Supervisor Chatham and Road Commissioner Breuning for investigation and report to the Board.

PETITION FOR CHANGE OF BOUNDARIES OF SHASTA AND CAMPTON SCHOOL DISTRICTS

Petition for change of boundaries of Shasta and Campton School Districts having been regularly set for hearing at this time and proof of mailing and of posting of notice of hearing being on file, hearing is held.

County School Superintendent Lucy Hunt explains the reason for the filing of the petition.

The Clerk announces that a petition opposing the change of boundaries is on file. with approximately 135 signatures, said petition having been received and filed January 23. 1952.

Eleven persons personally appear in opposition to granting of petition and four in favor.

Robert Litsch, Dr. John Strode, Well White and Glenna Williams orally protest the proposed change and Mrs. Mary Snow speaks in favor of the change.

On motion of Supervisor Turner, seconded by Supervisor Meeker, the petition is denied by unanimous vote.

ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING JUDICIAL DISTRICTS

On motion of Supervisor Meeker, seconded by Supervisor Turner and passed by unanimous vote, ordinance is enacted creating nine Judicial Districts in place of the Nine Townships, establishing boundaries of said Districts and fixing compensation of Judges of said Justice Courts of Districts. CAR STALLS

Discussion is had regarding allocation of car stalls for cars of County employees. Custodian Lloyd Knox reports that there are 17 car stalls, two of which have no roof.

By motion duly seconded and carried, it is ordered that car stalls be allocated as follows:

5 stalls for use by the Sheriff's Office, l of which is to be used for the matron's car;

7 stalls for use of County owned cars;

1 stall for the Court reporter;

1 stall for the Probation Officer;

1 stall for the Coroner.

The two remaining stalls which have no roof are unallocated.

The custodian is directed to paint the name of the office, to which the stalls are allocated, on the stalls pursuant to above order.

INSURANCE POLICIES

On motion of Supervisor Turner, seconded by Supervisor Plumb, the following insurance policies are accepted:

Aetna-No. 1MF1-343396 in the amount of \$383,665.39, expiration date January 4, 1955.

Hartford Fire Insurance Company, No. 41857, being a renewal of No. 36317, in the amount of \$187,400.00, expiring January 4, 1952.

Weldon Oxley of the firm of Nye and Oxley explains the schedule of insurance expiring February 15, 1952, stating that the values on county owned properties have not been changed for over two years. On motion of Supervisor Meeker, seconded by Supervisor Plumb, the Clerk is authorized to sign a statement of values to be prepared by Nye and Oxley.

It is agreed that allocation of new insurance is to be made to agents not now receiving premiums for county insurance, each supervisor to designate the agent to whom the new business is to be awarded.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO CLAIM APPORTIONMENT AND PROVIDE MATCHING FUNDS

WHEREAS, the Secondary Highways Act of 1951, an urgency measure which establishes the policy of the State Legislature toward Federal-Aid Secondary Highway Funds, which is now in effect, and

WHEREAS, said Act provides that any County of this State which will intend to claim all or a specified portion of the second year apportionment provided by said Act shall notify the State Highway District Engineer within sixty (60) days of the receipt of the Department's motice of apportionment, and

WHEREAS, the County of Shasta received the Department's notice on or about the 10th day of December 1951.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the County of Shasta file its intention to claim all of the second year apportionment provided in said Act. and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED

That the County of Shasta does hereby agree to provide matching funds for said second year apportionment as required by said Act.

EXCHANGE OF STATE SCHOOL AND NATIONAL FOREST LANDS

Mr. John Callahan from the State Forest Service and Mr. Robert E. Jones, Forest Supervisor for the United States Department of Agriculture, Shasta National Forest, present the matter of the application of the State of California to exchange State school lands for National forest lands to be added to the Mt. Home Tract within the Sequoia National Forest and Tulare County.

Tentative approval is given to the proposed exchange. Supervisor Meeker is appointed to check the matter with the Northern California County Supervisors Association and report to this Board.

OVERTIME FOR COUNTY ROAD WORKERS

On motion of Supervisor Plumb, seconded by Supervisor Chatham, resolution is passed by unanimous vote limiting County road workers to four hours overtime for any eight-hour day, except when specifically authorized by the Road Commissioner; straight time to be allowed for such overtime work. Overtime is to be only for snow removal and other emergencies, this resolution to be retroactive to December 15, 1951.

ROAD MATTERS

Letter is read from Board of Supervisors of Trinity County regarding snow removal on the French Gulch--Trinity Center road to the county line. The letter is referred to Road Commissioner E. D. Breuning.

PETITION -- Sutter Street in Alta Subdivision.

Petition with eighteen signatures is read requesting the Board of Supervisors to take into the county road system Sutter Street, off Highway 99, easterly to Polk Street in Alta Subdivision. The petition is referred to Supervisor Turner and Road Commissioner E. D. Breuning.

WALNUT STREET in McArthur

Letter is read from Frederick E. Lucas, Superintendent of Fall River Joint Unified School District requesting the county to maintain that portion of road from the end of Walnut Street into the teachers houses on the high school property at McArthur, about three city blocks in length.

Since this land is not now deeded to Shasta County, the road in question cannot be maintained by county road crews. The request is referred to Supervisor Meeker and Road Commissioner E. D. Breuning.

SNOW REMOVAL

Road Commissioner E. D. Breuning is authorized to recheck a request by the Fall River school trustees that the road to Day be kept open all winter. It is suggested that agreements for snow removal by the counties of Lassen, Modoc and Shasta be worked out, such agreement now being in force between Modoc and Shasta Counties. The Road Commissioner is authorized to check with Modoc County to see whether or not the terms of the agreement are being fulfilled.

By motion duly seconded and carried, deed from the Pacific Cas and Electric Company for right of way on road at Hat π l Power House is accepted and the Clerk is directed to place said deed of record.

County Assessor John Klukkert requests the remodeling of two rooms at the north end of the third floor of the Courthouse for use of his department, stating that windows would need to be installed, ceilings, etc. The matter is referred to Custodian Lloyd Knox and Surveyor Breuning to report on costs of work desired.

PARCELING SYSTEM ASSESSOR'S OFFICE

On motion of Supervisor Turner, seconded by Supervisor Chatham, resolution is passed by unanimous vote authorizing the Assessor to delineate parcels for the purpose of assessing same and number said parcels on maps, pursuant to the provisions of Section 327 of the Revenue and Taxation Code.

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED that, when the county assessor possesses a complete and accurate map of any land situated within the county, the assessor may delineate parcels thereon for the purpose of assessing the same, as provided in Section 327 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, and shall number said parcels on said map in the manner hereinafter specified.

The complete and accurate map is deemed to be the assessor's master maps, which together with index maps, show areas of property within the county in sufficient detain to clearly identify them as to size, shape, and location with official survey maps or known survey points. The complete and accurate map herein referred to is deemed to be not only the master maps together with index maps now in the possession of the assessor but also all hereinafter coming into his possession until he has a complete and accurate map of all land within the county. Such master detail maps are to be arranged in numbered books with the maps numbered numerically starting with No. 1 in each book. (Said map consisting of the master detail maps and indexes and index maps should conform to the coordinated map system suggested in the Standard Committee Report No. 6.)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that when such complete and accurate map has been parcelled and numbered as herein indicated, such map shall be known as the "Assessors Map" and such map or a copy thereof shall at all times be publicly displayed in the office of the assessor, and thereafter land may be described by reference to such

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the assessor shal delineate and assign parcel numbers to each parcel in the manner hereinafter indicated on said map for purposes of assessment in accordance with law as to use and ownership and as to the revenue districts and taxing agencies in which the property is situated.

single section of land sectionized by the United States Government contains more than 640 acres. Where a tract of sectionized land contains more than 640 acres, it shall be delineated into parcels and assigned parcel numbers coextensive with sections and fraction of sections in said tract.

A. THE PARCET WARRENT WARR

The parcel number shall consist of three parts as follows:

- (1) The number of the map book of the assessor's master maps of the county in which the particular master map showing the property is located.
- (2) The first two digits of the second part of the number shall represent the page number of this master map in the respective map book. The number "O" shall be used in front of map pages 1 to 9 of each book.

 The third digit of the second part shall represent the block number on the respective map page when the area is divided into blocks. When there is only one block to a map page the second number shall be the map page number as well as the block number but shall not exceed three digits.
- (3) The third part of the number shall be the number of the parcel on the map page if not in a numbered block and if in a numbered block the number of the particular parcel within the block. In describing parcels on a map page that is not subdivided into blocks, a parcel would be described, for example, as "3-36-9", blocks, which would mean Book 3 of Assessor's Maps, Map Page 36, and Parcel 9 on that map. If the parcel is on a map page subdivided into blocks, the description would be, for example, "3-363-5" which would mean Book 3 of Assessor's Maps, Block 363 (Map Page 36, Block 3) and Parcel 5 within that block.

B. ORIGINAL NUMBERING

The original numbering of the parcels shall be done in the following manner:

- (2) The block numbers shall be developed by assigning No. I to the upper left hand block on each master map and the other block numbers assigned consecutively downward by column from left to the right. The block numbers should begin with No. I on each master map.
- (3) In numbering the individual parcels on each master map that is not divided into blocks the numbering should be generally from left to right beginning at the upper left hand corner. If there are several distinctive areas on a map, those areas may be numbered consecutively if in the judgment of the assessor that is the most practicable. Individual parcels within each block shall begin with No. l and shall be numbered consecutively as follows: (a) If a majority of the lots in any block face on streets running in a general northerly and southerly direction, the numbering shall start at the top left corner of the block and proceed down to the lower left hand corner of the block, then over to the upper right corner of the block and down to the lower right corner of the block. (b) If a majority of the lots in any block face on streets running in a general easterly and westerly direction, the numbering shall start at the top left corner of the block and proceed across to the top right corner of the block, then back to the lower left corner of the block and proceed across to the lower right corner of the block.
- (4) If the arrangement of blocks or lots is such that the above system is not applicable, the assessor shall number the parcels by the system most similar, in the judgment of the assessor, to the system set forth above.

C. DIVISIONS AND COMBINATIONS

The parcel number assigned to a particular parcel shall never be used to designate another parcel. In the event that a parcel is divided or combined with another parcel, a new parcel number or numbers next following the last used parcel number for that block or map page shall be assigned to the new parcel of parcels. Divisions and combinations of parcels need only be made each year for the preparation of the new assessment roll except that divisions shall be made immediately and new parcel numbers assigned when requested for the payment to current taxes on part of an assessment, as provided for by Chapter 3, Part 5, Division 1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code or the partial redemption of property, as provided for by Chapter 2, Part 7, Division 1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code.

The new parcel or parcels shall be so delineated on the map or block with colored ink of otherwise so that an inspection will readily disclose not only the new parcels but also the old parcels. When a parcel is first divided into two of more parcels, the division including the new parcel number shall be shown in red, a second division within a parcel shown in green and a third division shown in orange. The new parcel area shall be outlined in the respective color so that it is definitely and clearly indicated. When a parcel number is changed a single line of the color used in making the change may be drawn through the former parcel number or boundry. The parcel number and boundries of any parcel which is no longer used for assessment purposes shall not be deleted, obliterated, or made illegible.

In the event that the combinations of divisions on any block of map are so numerous that it becomes difficult to show the old and new parcels, the assessor shall prepare a new map page for that particular area and place it in the Map Book Volume immediately preceding the old map page, and delineate thereon the existing parcels. Appropriate no tation shall be made on both the old and new map page referring one to the other and indicating the date the new map page was inserted.

The master maps must be kept and maintained in such manner and in such condition that a person of ordinary intelligence can determine therefrom at any time the location of any parcel of land assessed by reference to said map in the then current fiscal year or in any prior year.

D. NOTICE TO TAX COLLECTOR AND REDEMPTION OFFICER

When parcels that are delinquent are divided or combined the assessor shall notify the Tax Collector and Redemption Officer of such division or combination.

COTTONWOOD COMMUNITY CLUB-DEED TO PROPERTY

HEARING PROPOSED ROAD BETWEEN BONNEYVIEW AND ANDERSON

Road Commissioner Breuning introduces Mr. Gibson and Mr. Lewis of Public Utilities District, Mr. Trask of the State Division of Highways and representative from the Southern Pacific Company. General discussion is had regarding the proposed road on the east side of the Southern Pacific railroad track between Bonneyview and Anderson.

Authorization is given to Road Commissioner Breuning to work up a proposal for this project, with costs of rights of way, etc., for submission to the Board of Supervisors to be transmitted by the Board to the parties interested in this road.

BUCKEYE ROAD



Sheriff Balma states that the office of Constable in this District has grown to a point where he believes it is no longer necessary to supplement the office with a salary as Deputy Sheriff, and suggests that the salary as set forth for the Constable of said District and fees of said Constable constitute the salary for said official. Mr. Alvares is questioned regarding acceptance of position under these conditions and states his willingness to take the position on that basis.

On motion of Supervisor Turner, seconded by Supervisor Meeker, George Alvares is appointed Constable of Redding Judicial District to fill the unexpired term of John King, deceased, said appointment being effective October 15th, 1952.

ORDINANCE NO. 338

Sheriff John Balma requests a revision of the Ordinance now in effect setting the salaries of the Undersheriff and the Chief Deputy Sheriff. Petition to take territory from the Cedar Creek School District and annex said territory to the Montgomery Creek Union School District having been presented to the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta on September 24, 1952 and hearing on said petition having been regularly set for this time, and no one appearing in opposition to the granting of the petition, letter is read from County Superintendent Schools Lucy Hunt recommending that the petition be granted.

On motion of Supervisor Meeker, seconded by Supervisor Chatham, resolution is passed by unanimous vote changing boundaries of school districts as follows:

ROAD MEETING

Mr. Roy Ballou, Chairman of the Road Committee of the Grand Jury, and Mr. Weldon Oxley, Foreman of said body, request the Board of Supervisors to conduct the meeting for discussion of road matters on Saturday, November 29th, 1952 at 10:00 a.m. It is agreed to call a special meeting for discussion of road problems on the date suggested.

CEMETERY DISTRICT PETITION

Deputy District Attorney Claude Caldwell states that a petition for formation of a new cemetery district has been presented to him. He advises that some one be named to make and file a report.

On motion of Supervisor Plumb, seconded by Supervisor Meeker, Mrs. Gertrude Steger is appointed for the purpose of making and filing a report and the sum of \$150.00 is set as the estimated cost of necessary publications of notices, etc., bond in the amount of \$300.00 to be filed.

ASSESSOR'S OFFICE

Assessor Harrison stresses the immediate need for more space for use of his office. The custodian of the Court House and Grounds is authorized to make a survey of the rooms in the basement of the Court House and determine the approximate cost of putting in ceilings, electrical work, etc., to make the basement rooms available for use by the Assessor. The Assessor is requested to submit a rough draft of the floor plan and of the amount of space he deems necessary for his use.

DEFENSE COUNSEL SUPERIOR AND JUSTICE COURTS

Mr. Frank W. Shuman, Chairman of a committee from the Shasta County Bar Association, appointed to handle requests for appointment of defense counsel, presents the matter of proposed fees for payment of defense counsel in the various courts.

On motion of Supervisor Turner, seconded by Supervisor Chatham, the suggested plan for fees and appointments as presented by Mr. Shuman is approved by unanimous vote, fees recommended being as follows:

The following fees and mileage were recommended for appointments in the respective Justice Courts through the preliminary examination or waiver of said examination.

- (a) Justice Courts of Redding, Central Valley, Anderson, and Cottonwood, the sum of \$25.00 for each appointment.
- (b) Justice Courts of Burney and Fall River Mills, the sum of \$50.00.
- (c) Justice Court at Round Mountain, the sum of \$40.00.
- (d) Mileage of 8ϕ per mile both ways when the attorneys so appointed use their own transportation.
- (e) If the preliminary examinations are held in Redding, then the minimum schedule for Redding would apply regardless of what court makes the appointment.

If an attorney is appointed in the Superior Court he should be entitled to a fee of \$25.00 for services rendered through the plea. If the case goes to trial then he should be entitled to a similar compensation for each day of trial or for each day of further proceedings after the plea.

In case there are two or more co-defendants then the attorney should be entitled to the minimum plus \$15.00 for each extra defendant.

These are suggested minimums. It being understood that the Judges may allow a greater compensation when they deem the circumstances warrant it.

ANDERSON SEWER ASSESSMENTS

Mr. George F. Heidel discusses the original basis of assessments for the Anderson Sewer and requests that a decision be made as to whether or not additional charges should be paid for the property he has recently purchased which do not front on the sewer line or street. Letter is read from Clair A. Hill and statement to the Board of Supervisors from the Auditor W. F. Weber is read.

On motion of Supervisor Plumb, seconded by Supervisor Turner, County Surveyor Ernest D. Breuning is authorized to prepare a statement directing the method by which the assessments in the Anderson Sewer District regarding the property in question shall be divided: it being understood that adjustment will be made next year on the parcels as set forth in Mr. Weber's statement.

RESOLUTION RE LEGISLATION TO PROVIDE FOR CONTRIBUTIONS IN LIEU OF TAXES ON PROPERTY HELD BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

Assessor Myron R. Harrison presents proposed resolution relating to legislation to provide for contributions in lieu of taxes on Federally owned lands.

On motion of Supervisor Chatham, seconded by Supervisor Meeker, resolution is adopted as follows:

WHEREAS, the avoidance of taxation of Federally-owned real

property has lead to a serious impairment of the local general

property tax base in many localities; and

WHEREAS, such a condition is prevalent in several areas in the State of California, and is particularly serious in the County of Shasta because 34% of the assessable area of the County is government owned, with an added 19% tax burden placed on the County of Shasta taxpayers: and

WHEREAS, the inequities developing through continuing removal from the local tax rolls of property acquired by the Federal government have heretofore been acknowledged in that corrective legislation has, from time to time, been introduced in Congress; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Bureau of the Budget did recently prepare an analysis of the extent of the tax avoidance of Federally-owned property; and

WHEREAS, there was introduced by Senator Richard Nixon in the Congress of the United States on May 22, 1951, Senate Bill 1519, based on the Budget Bureau's analysis, which, if amended to provide that its provisions for contributions in lieu of taxes should be applicable to properties acquired by the Federal Government in 1939 and thereafter, would materially correct the present burdensome and inquitable conditions found in this county and other areas throughout the United States: and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta, State of California, believes continuation of the present tax avoidance to be contrary to good governmental administration and to sound public policy, both locally and nationally: NOW THEREFORE

IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Congress of the United States, and particularly the California delegation, is requested to take appropriate and necessary action to obtain enactment into law of Senate Bill 1519, amended as suggested herein, during the forthcoming final session of the 82nd Congress.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that this Board approve and concur with the resolution of the National Association of Assessing Officers, dated September 24, 1952, urging Congress to correct certain practices in connection with the drawing of contracts for the procurement of the implements of national defense, which practices land to similar impairment of the local general property tax.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE Assessor of the County of Shasta be authorized to furnish copies of this resolution to such other organizations and officials as may have a proper interest in this matter and urge their vigorous support in encouraging immediate enactment of such urgently needed remedial legislation.
