Petition filed July 24th, 1952; portion of Fifth Street in the Town of Fall River Mills which extends in a Northwesterly direction from U. S. Highway No. 299.

Road Commissioner recommends that the petition be granted and states that funds should be included in the 53-54 budget, subject to financial restrictions.

Old Conveyor Road - Buckeye County Water District Road:

Petition filed November 3rd, 1952; the old conveyor road, beginning at the Buckeye County Road and running through the Hugh Williamson property, and continuing to the Walker Mine Road; length, first Section not listed as to length. Section 800 feet.

Road Commissioner recommends that the petition be approved, subject to furnishing title report and deed to 40' right of way clear of all encumberances and encroachments.

Buckeye County Water District Road also included in this recommendation.

Angelus City Subdivision:

Petition filed January 5, 1953; the old Buckeye Road in Angelus City Subdivision approximately 1000 feet in length.

Road Commissioner recommends that the petition should be approved as it is a portion of County Road which has never been abandoned.

Road Near Enterprise off County Road 33-C:

Road Commissioner reports that this should be held for recommendation from Mr. Chatham.

Hill Street in Verde Vale Subdivision

WHEREAS, A 200-bed general, medical and surgical hospital in San Diego was approved but has never been built due to the failure of the Federal Government to appropriate the necessary funds therefore; and

WHEREAS, The standard of medical care for California veterans in the existing hospitals has been adversely affected by reductions in the budget of the Veterans Administration: and

WHEREAS, It is a well known fact that hundreds of thousands of veterans have been migrating to the State of California from every state of the Union since the close of World War I and the veteran population of California will continure to increase by reason of the Korean emergency, and for that reason applications by veterans for hospitalization have shown a steady increase: and

WHEREAS, The Veterans Administration has not only cause a cut-back in the number of operating beds, but it has also reduced the standard of medical came, the amount of out-patient treatment for veterans, the amount of medical research, and a shortage in the medical supplies in these veterans hospitals: now, therefore be it

By motion duly seconded and carried, the salary of Robert LeBarre, Farmer at the Shasta County Hospital Farm is increased from \$175.00 per month to \$200.00 per month, effective August 1st, 1953, with full maintenance for himself and wife.

RESOLUTION NO. C-47-RESCINDING APPLICATION FALL RIVER-DANA ROAD

WHEREAS, the State of California, under Chapter 47, Statutes of 1944 (Fourth Extra Session), as amended, has appropriated funds to provide financial assistance to local agencies, defined therein as counties, cities, or cities and counties of the State of California, so that they may engage in a large public works construction program; and

WHEREAS, the <u>County of Shasta</u>, hereinafter called "Local Agency" has submitted to the Director of Finance, under the aforesaid Act and the rules and regulations prescribed thereunder, an application for an allotment in the sum of <u>Three Thousand Three Hundred Thirty Seven and 14/100 Dollars (\$3.337.14) as the State's share of the estimated cost of plan preparation or site acquisition for a public works project, described in said application as <u>"Fall River-Dana Highway F.A.S. 1076"</u>, which application is identified under Application No. <u>47/255</u>; and</u>

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance has by Executive Order No. P-203, on March 26, 1946, approved the aforesaid application and allotted to the Local Agency the sum of Three Thousand Three Hundred Thirty Seven and 14/100 Dollars (\$3,337.14); and

WHEREAS, the Local Agency desires to withdraw the aforesaid application because plans will not be completed;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Local Agency does hereby rescind its Resolution No. PW2, adopted January 28, 1946, authorizing the submission to the Director of Finance of the aforementioned application; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified duplicate copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Director of Finance, one of which will be for the use of the State Controller.

FALL RIVER-DANA ROAD AND DERSCH ROAD-REPAYMENT CHAPTER 47 FUNDS
