I am also against the Shasta County Hospital being used as an experimental station by doctors over whom we have no control or supervision, and who are performing services unknown to us. It is my view that such an arrangement will not meet with the approval of the majority of the taxpayers of Shasta County.
For these reasons I vote "no" and direct the Clerk to incorpor- ate my remarks in the minutes of this Board, word for word, which will be my protection in the event litigation is in- stituted against me. "





This being the time set for hearing on completed budget, Dr. Earnest Dozier presents objections to Welfare Budgets.

Motion is made by Supervisor Plumb, seconded by Supervisor Colby, that the budget be adopted as submitted and that the tax rates for the fiscal year 1941-1942 be fixed as set forth in the preliminary budget. By motion duly seconded and carried, resolution is passed adopting the budget

There having been filed with the County Auditor, prior to the interval 1st day of July, 1941, by each county official, elective or appointive, in charges of an office, department, service or institution, an itemized estimate showing both the probable revenue from sources other than taxation and all expednitures required by his department for the ensuing fiscal year as required by Section 3714 of the Political Code, and the Board of Supervisors having submitted to the Auditor a statement showing all new road and bridge construction to be financed from any source and also the cost of road and bridge maintenance or betterment and all other expenditures proposed to be made;

And the Auditor having prepared the tabulation required by law showing the complete expenditure program of the county for the current fiscal year and the sources of revenue by which it is to be financed;

And said tabulation having been submitted by the Auditor to the Board of Supervisors on the 20th day of August, 1941, and having been duly considered by the Board and any revisions, reductions or rates which were deemed advisable having been made on said date, and said tabulation being adopted by said Board of Supervisors as the preliminary county budget;

And the same having been mimeographed in pamphlet form and a notice having been published in a newspaper of general circulation stating that said budget had been prepared and was available for distribution to all tax-payers desiring a copy thereof and setting forth that on the 20th day of August, 1941, the Board of Supervisors would meet for the purpose of fixing the final budget and determining the tax rates and levies, said notice being given at least ten days before said 20th day of August, 1941, as will appear from the affidavit of publication on file with the Clerk of this Board, which is hereby referred to;

And the Board of Supervisors having met, pursuant to said notice, on Wednesday, the 20th day of August, 1941, and a hearing being thereupon held upon said budget and upon each and every item thereof,

RESOLUTION DECLARING GREAT EMERGENCY EXISTING FOR REPAIRING OLD HIGH SCHOOL BUILDING.			
Resolution declaring great emergency and authorizing contract for repair of old High School Building is passed as follows:			
WHEREAS, the President of the United States has, by proclamation, declared a state of unlimited national emergency; and			

WHEREAS, the United States Government has embarked upon an extensive program of national defense; and

WHEREAS, the County of Shasta owns a certain building known and designated as the "Old High School Building", situated on Placer Street in the City of Redding, the upper portion of which building has been vacate and unused for a considerable period of time; and

WHEREAS, the United States Government and the United States Army have suddenly requested, and have been granted a lease to said premises for the purpose of establishing and maintaining an air-raid alarm station; and

WHEREAS, extensive repairs are necessary to be made to said building to make it fit for occupancy and suitable for the purpose of the United States Army; and

WHEREAS, it is imperative, by reason of the aforesaid national emergency and defense program, that said work of repairs be completed at the earliest possible time;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors, of the County of Shasta, by un<u>animous</u> of all members of said Board hereby finds and declares that there is a great emergency requiring the immediate repair of said Old High School Building and that there is no time for the submission of plans and specifications for such repairs and for the calling of bids for such work, and said Board further finds and declares that it is necessary for the welfare and protection of the County of Shasta, and for proper cooperation with the United States Government and the United States Army that said repairs be made by a competent contractor upon contract without the calling for bids.

The said Board further finds that J. P. Brennan, of the City of Redding, is an experienced, capable and responsible contractor who is willing and able to perform the necessary repairs within the time available and at a fair and reasonable price, as incorporated in that certain draft building contract, a copy of which is annexed hereto and hereby referred to and made a part of this resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta, that the Chairman of the Board be and he is hereby authorized and directed NOES: None ABSENT: None.
