RESOLUTION CONSOLIDATING PRECINCTS, ETC.

The following resolution consolidating precincts, naming election officers, etc. for special election is passed:

The Board of Supervisors of Shasta County, California, in accordance with the Election Proclamation issued by Hon. Earl Warren, Governor of the State of California, do hereby proclaim that a Special Election will be held throughout said county on Tuesday, August 31, 1943, to fill the vacancy in the office of Representative to the Congress of the United States from the Second Congressional District, caused by the

For the purpose of said election the following precincts have been consolidated:

Redding #7 Precinct, Redding #7A Precinct, Redding #8 Precinct and Redding #8A Precinct, consolidated into and designated as Northwest Redding Consolidated Precinct;

Cayton Precinct and Lindsay Precinct, consolidated into and designated as Cayton, Consolidated Precinct;

Atkins Precinct and Fern Precinct, consolidated into and designated as Atkins, Consolidated Precinct;

North Burney Precinct and South Burney Precinct, consolidated into and designated as Burney Consolidated Precinct;

Bass Precinct, Copper Precinct and Winthrop Precinct, consolidated into and designated as Bass Consolidated Precinct;

Shasta Dam and Kennett Precinct, consolidated into and designated as Shasta Dam Consolidated Precinct;

Balls Precinct, East Anderson Precinct, North Anderson Precinct, South Anderson Precinct and West Anderson Precinct, consolidated into and designated as Anderson Consolidated Precinct;

East Cottonwood Precinct and West Cottonwood Precinct, consolidated into and designated as Cottonwood, Consolidated Precinct.

That at said Special Election the polls will be open from the hour of 7 o'clock a.m., to the hour of 7 o'clock p.m., on the day thereof, and that during said hours said election will be held at the legally designated polling places in each precinct in said county, and that the hereinafter named persons have been appointed to serve as election officers in their respective election precincts; that the Inspector of each election board is authorized and directed to furnish ballot boxes, booths and guard rails for his paid election precinct; that any person who having been regularly appointed as an election officer, shall, without lawful excuse fail to act as such, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed thirty days or by both such fine and imprisonment:

WELFARE MATTERS

SALARY INCREASES REQUESTED

Auditor requests increase for deputies and or clerical assistants now receiving \$4.00 per day, amount not to exceed \$1600.00 per year to \$1700.00 per year, daily pay not to exceed \$4.50.  
District Attorney--requests raise of chief deputy to \$150.00 per month.  
School Superintendent--requests raise for deputy from \$100.00 to \$150.00 per month.

Sheriff requests relief man for work during vacations of deputies, requests relief deputies as needed.

Welfare Director requests raises as follows:

RESOLUTION ADOPTING BUDGET AND FIXING TAX RATE

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta did on the 20th day of August, 1943, duly and regularly pass a Resolution adopting a budget and fixing a rate for the County of Shasta, State of California, and

WHEREAS, said Resolution does not correctly speak the truth with reference to two items and in such respect is contrary to the determination of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta made at and prior to the time of the passage of such resolution, and

WHEREAS, it is desired to make the record speak the truth and to re-adopt and ratify and correct said Resolution, and

WHEREAS, the errors in such record and Resolution are as follows, to-wit:

1. Such Resolution recites that the tax rate for "Advertising" is .1610 per \$100.00 of assessed valuation of property, whereas in truth and in fact the tax rate fixed and determined by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta prior to and at the time of the adoption of such Resolution for "Advertising" was .0161 per \$100.00 of assessed valuation of property;

2. Such Resolution recites that the tax rate for "Unappropriated Reserve" is .0633 per \$100.00 of assessed valuation of property, whereas in truth and in fact the tax rate fixed and determined by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta prior to and at the time of the adoption of such Resolution for "Unappropriated Reserve" was .0682 per \$100.00 of assessed valuation of property, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta desires to re-adopt and ratify and correct said Resolution and to make the record speak the truth in the particulars hereinabove mentioned,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta, State of California, as follows, to-wit:

1. That all of the foregoing recitals are true and correct;
2. That the Resolution adopting a Budget and Fixing a Tax Rate hereinabove mentioned and passed on August 20, 1943, is hereby re-adopted and ratified and corrected and made to speak the truth; and, as so re-adopted, ratified and corrected and made to speak the truth, is in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

RESOLUTION ADOPTING BUDGET AND FIXING TAX RATE.

WHEREAS, ther having been filed with the County Auditor prior to the 10th day

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of July, 1943, by each county official, elective or appointive in charge of an office, department, service or institution, an itemized estimate showing both probable revenue from sources other than taxation and all expenditures required by his department for the ensuring fiscal year as required by Section 3714 of the Political Code, and the Board of Supervisors having submitted to the Auditor a statement showing all new road and bridge construction to be financed from any source and also the cost of road and bridge maintenance or betterment and all other expenditures proposed to be made; and

WHEREAS, the Auditor having prepared the tabulation required by law showing the complete expenditure program of the county for the current fiscal year and the sources of revenue by which it is to be financed; and

WHEREAS, said tabulation having been submitted by the Auditor to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors on the 19th day of July, 1943, and having been duly considered by the board and any revisions, reduction or rates which were deemed advisable having been made on or before July 26, 1943, and said tabulation being on said day adopted by said Board of Supervisors as the preliminary county budget; and

WHEREAS, the same having been mimeographed in pamphlet form and a notice having been published in a newspaper of general circulation stating that said budget had been prepared and was available for distribution to all tax-payers desiring a copy thereof and setting forth that on the 20th day of August, 1943, the Board of Supervisors would meet for the purpose of fixing the final budget and determining the tax rates and levies, said notice being given at least ten days before said 20th day of August, 1943, as will appear from the affidavit of publication on file with the Clerk of this Board, which is hereby referred to; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors having met, pursuant to said notice, on Friday, the 20th day of August, 1943, and a hearing being thereupon held upon said budget and upon each and every item thereof, said hearing being completed on the 20th day of August, 1943,

NOW, THEREFORE, upon the conclusion of said hearing, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta, State of California hereby fixes and determines each item of the budget as hereinafter set out and by this Resolution hereby adopts the budget as so finally determined and hereupon fixes the rate of county taxes as hereinafter set out, the detailed budget being in the office of the Clerk of this Board, reference being hereby made to the same.






