

COYOTE RESOLUTION PASSED.




By motion duly seconded and carried, Resolution is passed putting Five Dollar bounty of coyotes.

WOODEN SCHOOL DISTRICT BONDS.

By motion duly seconded and carried, the following resolution is passed:

Resolution and Order of Board of Supervisors

Of Shasta County, State of California.

In re Issue of Bonds of Wooden School District.

WHEREAS, on the 11th day of December, 1931, the board of trustees of Wooden School District, deemed it advisable to call, and by resolution and order of said board of trustees duly and regularly passed and adopted by them and entered on the minutes of the said board of trustees on said day, did call an election, and resolve and order:

That an election be called and held on the 12th day of January 1932 in said School District, for the purpose of submitting to the electors of said School District the question of issuing and selling bonds of said School District in the amount of

Four Thousand 00/100 dollars,

to run not exceeding 10 years and to bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum, payable annually for the first year the bonds have to run and semi-annually thereafter, for the purpose of raising money for the following purposes:*

- The purchasing of school lots;
The building or purchasing of one or more school buildings;
The making of alterations or additions to the school building or buildings;
The repairing, restoring or rebuilding of any school building damaged, injured or destroyed by fire or other public calamity;
The supplying of school buildings with furniture or necessary apparatus;
The improving of school grounds;
The liquidating of any indebtedness already incurred for the purposes herebefore mentioned;
(all of which were thereby united to be voted upon as one single proposition).

WHEREAS, an election was held in said School District on the 12th day of January 1932, in conformity with the said resolution and order of the said board of trustees of said School District, and all the proceedings had in the premises have been certified to the board of supervisors by the board of trustees of said School District, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the said certified proceedings show, and after a full examination and investigation this board have found and do hereby find and declare:

That in accordance with a resolution and order of the board of trustees of Wooden School District, passed and adopted on the 11th day of December 1931, an election was duly called in said School District, and was held in said School District on the 12th day of January 1932, and that notice of said election was given by posting notices signed by all the members of the board of trustees of said School District in three public places in said School District for more than twenty days next before said election, and by publishing such notice in Fall River Tidings, a newspaper printed and published in Shasta County, State of California, not less than once in each calendar week for three successive calendar weeks before said election, which notice so posted and published, was in the form required by law.

That prior to opening said polls the said inspector and judges of election conducting said election, took the oath of office as required by law, and thereafter conducted the said election as required by law, and at the close thereof canvassed the votes cast thereat, and certified the result of said election to the board of trustees of said School District, and to them made return of the poll list and roster of voters, and tally list of said election.

That on the 19th day of January 1932, the seventh day after the said election, and at one o'clock p. m. of said day, the board of trustees of said School District met and canvassed the said returns of said election, from which said returns the said board of trustees found and declared and this board finds and declares that there were 33 votes cast at said election, and that more than two-thirds thereof, to-wit: 33 votes were cast for issuing said bonds, and no votes and no more were cast against issuing said bonds,

(1) That not to exceed three special relief orders shall be issued to any person or family, by the Welfare Department or by any supervisor, it being understood that if permanent relief is necessary that regular applications must be presented to the Board of Supervisors.

(2) That no special relief orders, for any purpose, except for medicine ordered by the county physician, shall be granted either by the Welfare Department or by any supervisor, to anyone already receiving either stste, county or state and county aid monthly, except on an order of the Board of Supervisors.

(3) That special relief orders shall not aggregate over \$10.00 monthly for any one person, nor over \$25.00 monthly for any family, except upon an order of the Board of Supervisors.

(4) That allowances for rent for any one person shall not exceed the sum of \$6.00 monthly and for more than one person the sum of \$10.00 monthly except on an order of the Board of Supervisors.

(5) That the Welfare Department allow no rent to single persons as long as any of the county-owned cabins are vacant and can be used for the purpose.


