FULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE GOVERNMENT AND MANAGMENT OF THE SHASTA COUNTY HOSPITAL AND SHASTA COUNTY FAFM.

PEFAMBLE

Fecognizing, as this board must, the necessity for the preservation of the health of our people by prompt, modern and adequate diagnosis of disease to the end that the individual shall be protected from illness and/or restored to health and prevented from becoming a public charge and maintained in his usefulness as a unit in the social structure of our community and further recognizing, as we must, the policy of the law to provide suitable care and maintenence for aged and infirm residents of our county who are indigents and dependent, and,

WHEFEAS, it is provided by Sections 4223 and 4224 of the Political Code of the State of California, that the Board of Supervisors may establish and maintain a County Hospital and establish a County Farm in connection therewith, and prescribe the rules and regulations for the government and management of the same, and appoint the necessary officers and employees thereof who shall hold office during the pleasure of the board.

NOW, THEREFORE, in light of these considerations, the board now hereby adopts the following rulés and regulations for the government and management of of the Shasta County Hospital and the Shasta County Farm:

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Section I.

There shall be a Medical Director of the Shasta County Hospital who shall be a duly licensed physician and surgeon under the laws of the State of California. It shall be his duty, except as hereinafter provided, to supervise and manage the entire conduct of the hospital relating to the treatment and care of patients at said hospital, and, subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors, appoint all medical, surgical and lay assistants.

Section II.

There shall be a Superintendent of Nurses of the Shasta County Hospital who shall be a registered nurse under the laws of the State of California, and duly qualified by age and experience to perform the duties of such Superintendent as hereinafter specified. It shall be her duty to supervise the nurses in said hospital and to supervise the patients confined in said hospital as to treatment and care and to assist the Medical Director as to the management and supervision of said. hospital. Said Superintendent of Nurses shall, in performance of such duties, act only under the direction and supervision of the Medical Director.

The Superintendent of Nurses shall reside at said Shasta County Hospital and shall be on call for duty twenty-four hours a day.

Section III.

There shall be a Superintendent of the County Farm and Hospital who shall be duly qualified by age and experience to perform the duties of such Superintendent as hereinafter specified. It shall be his duty to supervise and manage the entire conduct of the County Farm and set up and maintain an accounting system therefor, and subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors, appoint all assistants.

In addition thereto he shall perform such duties at the Shasta County Hospital relative to the management and supervision thereof which have not been specifically provided for herein to be performed by the Medical Director or his assistants. It shall be the duty of the Superintendent of the County Farm to purchase all food supplies for the residents at said County Farm and said County Hospital. The purchase of food supplies for patients at said County Hospital shall be subject to the direction and orders of the Medical Director.

Section IV.

It shall be the duty of the Superintendent of the County Farm and Hospital and the Medical Director of the Hospital to make on or before the lst day of July in each year, and file with the County Clerk an Inventory under oath, showing in detail all county property in his possession, or in his charge. Said Inventory sahll be kept of record by said County Clerk, and a true copy of said Inventory sahll be delivered by such officer to his successor in office, who must receipt therefor, which receipt shall be filed with the County Clerk.

Section V.

The following persons shall be eligible to admission for diagnosis

and treatment by the facilities and personnel of the Shasta County Hospital and its out patient clinics:

A. All persons required or permitted to be admitted to such hospital by any law of the State of California now existing, or hereafter to be passed. Wherever any such law required or permits the admission, diagnosis and treatment of an indigent person who was an actual bona fide resident thereof and who has insufficient means to pay for his maintenance in a private hospital after providing for those who legally claim his support.

B. All persons afflicted by accident or sudden illness of such nature that their physical welfare requires prompt and immediate treatment.

C. Such persons as may be injured or rendered suddenly ill and as to whom immediate hospitalization may be necessary as a result of a public disaster such as fire, eathrquake, floods, storms or epidemics.

D. Any person, the nature of whose illness or disability is such that the necessary equipment, facilities or personnel required for his diagnosis or treatment is not available at any other hospital within a reasonable distance which could afford him proper care and treatment.

Section VI.

All drugs and medicines, including narcotics, alcohol and alcoholic liquors, surgical dressings, minor medical, surgical, and diagnostic supplies for use in said hospital and farm shall be purchased in conformity with accepted bids when required by law. It shall be the duty of the Mèdical Director to supervise, manage, direct and approve the purchase of such supplies as above specified.

The purchase of such supplies shall be done by requisitions prepared in truplicate form and signed by the Medical Director. The original of such requisition shall be delivered to the place of business where the purchase is made; one copy shall be kept on file at the office of said County Hospital and one copy shall be delivered to the Superintendent of the County Farm and Hospital for monthly accounting. The purchase of all supplies for said County Farm and said County Hospital other than hereinabove provided for shall be made under the direction and supervision of the Superintendent of the County Farm and Hospital.

Section VII.

The purchase of any supplies for said County Farm and any other supplies for use in connection with said hospital shall be under the direction and supervision of the Superintendent of the County Farm and Hospital.

Section VIII

No person shall be admitted to the Shasta County Hospital or Shasta County Farm until permission is obtained in writing from the Supervisor in the Supervisorial District where such person seeking admission shall reside. No member of the Board of Supervisors shall grant written permission for admission to said Shasta County Hospital or Shasta County Farm until such person seeking admission shall have signed an affidavit containing sufficient information showing that he is eligible to admission.

The Welfare Agent of Shasta County shall have power to issue permits in writing for admission to the Shasta County Hospital to indigents in cases of emergency only.

Section IX

A patient shall not be admitted at said Shasta County Hospital or Shasta County Farm until his written permission is received, which permit shall be kept on file at said hospital or farm, as the case may be. When a patient is so admitted his valuables shall be immediately removed from his person in his presence, and an itemized list made thereof in duplicate. Such list must be verified by the official in charge and by the person whose valuables have been removed from his person. The original of such itemized list must be kept on file at said County Hospital or County Farm, as the case may be, and the duplicate thereof shall be kept by the person gaining admission

thereof.

All valuables must be kept in a separate receptacle provided for such purpose and in charge of the Superintendent of the County Farm and Hospital and must be appropriately marked for identification.

Section X.

That all previous ordinances or resolutions with reference to the rules and regulations of the management of said Shasta County Hospital and said Shasta County Farm in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section XI.

That an attested copy of these Rules and Regulations shall be furnished to the Medical Director, to the Superintendent of the County Hospital and Farm and to the County Auditor, and a copy shall be kept on file by the County Clerk.
