RESOLUTION ADOPTING BUDGET AND FIXING TAX RATE.

Whereas the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta, State of California, heretofore made an order directing each county official, elective or appointive, in charge of an office, department, service or institution, to file before the 10th day of July, 1928 with the County Auditor a detailed and itemized estimate showing both the probable revenue from sources other than taxation to his department and all expenditures required by his department for the ensuing fiscal year; and the Board of Supervisors having submitted to the Auditor a statement showing all new road and bridge construction to be a finance from any source and also the cost of road and bridge maintenance or betterment and all other expenditures proposed to be made;

And the Auditor having prepared a tabulation according to law showing the complete expenditure program of the county for the current fiscal year and the sources of revenue by which it is to be financed;

And said tabulation having been submitted by the Auditor to the Board of Supervisors before the 30th day of July, 1928, and having been thereupon considered by said board in detail and any revisions, reductions or rates having been deemed advisable having been made before the 10th day of August, 1928, and an item to be known as "Unbudgeted Reserve" having been added to said tabulation, and also an item known as the "General Reserve Fund" having been added, and said tabulation thereupon constituted the preliminary county budget;

And the same having been mimeographed in pamphlet form and a notice having been published in a newspaper of general circulation stating that said budget had been prepared and was available for distribution to all tax payers desiring a copy thereof and setting forth that on the 8th day of August, 1928, the Board of Supervisors would meet for the purpose of fixing the final budget and determining tax levies:

And the Board of Supervisors having duly met, pursuant to said notice, on Wednesday, August 8th, 1928, and a hearing being thereupon held upon said budget and being concluded the same day;

Upon the conclusion of said hearing, therefore, the Board of Supervisors of Shasta County hereby fixes and determines each item of the budget as hereinafter set out and by this resolution hereby adopts the budget as so finally determined and hereupon fixes the rate of county taxes as hereinafter set out;

RESOLUTION ADOPTING PROPOSAL FOR FORMATION OF JOINT HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

Whereas the Board of Directors of the Joint Highway District composed of Siskiyou, Shasta, and Tehama Counties, State of California, organized under an act of the State of California entitled "Act Providing for the Creation, Organization and Government of Joint Highway Districts Composed of Two or More Counties of the State of California" did regularly meet in the Office of the County Surveyor of the County of Tehama, in the Tehama County Courthouse, in the City of Red Bluff, State of California, on the 24th day of September, 1928, and did then and there at such meeting, after having been duly and regularly organized as provided by law, duly adopt a report entitled "Report of Board of Directors of Joint Highway District composed of Siskiyou, Shasta and Tehama Counties, State of California", in which report they did tentatively fix the route of the Public highway they contemplate constructing in pursuance of the act above referred to in Siskiyou County, California, extending from the State Highway at the town of Weed, County of Siskiyou, State of California, to a point where the public highway leading in a southerly direction from the City of Klamath Falls, in the State of Oregon, intersects the northern boundary line of the State of California, which route is designated and defined on the chart or blue print annexed to said report of said Board of Directors, and in which report said Board of Directors did determine the approximate total cost of said proposed district highway to be the sum of \$800,000.00, and that the portion of such total cost that should be borne and paid by each county within said joint highway District is as follows:- By Siskiyou County, the sum of \$84,000.00; by Shasta County, the sum of \$5,000.00; and by Tehama County, the sum of \$5,000.00; and that the amount that should be borne and paid by Shasta County and the amount that should be borne and paid by Tehama County should be paid in five equal annual installments, the first installment to be paid by said County of Shasta and by the County of Tehama as soon as the organization of said joint highway District has been completed; and that Siskiyou County, having already available \$31,500.00 of said sum of \$84,000.00 to contribute toward the construction of said district highway, should pay \$52,500.00 of said sum of \$84,000.00 in five equal annual installments, and should pay the first of said installments together with said sum of \$31,500.00 as soon as the organization of said joint highway district has been completed; and whereas, said Board of Directors of said Joint Highway District has caused a copy of said report or resolution to be filed with this Board of Supervisors of Shasta County, State of California,




