RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SHASTA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, STRIKING OFF, SELLING AND AWARDED TO THEBO, STARR AND ANDERTON, INCORPORATED, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS THE RIGHT, PRIVILEGE, AND FRANCHISE TO LAY, CONSTRUCT, OPERATE, MAINTAIN, USE REPLACE AND / OR REMOVE, A SYSTEM OF CONDUITS, MAINS AND PIPELINES, TOGETHER WITH SUCH VALVES, FITTINGS, COMPRESSORS AND OTHER EQUIPMENT APPURTENANT THERETO, AS THE GRANTEE OR GRANTEEES, HIS, ITS OR THEIR, SUCCESSORS OR ASSIGNS MAY DEEM NECESSARY OR CONVENIENT IN, UPON, UNDER, ALONG AND ACROSS PUBLIC STREETS, LANES, HIGHWAYS AND PUBLIC WAYS IN THE SAID COUNTY, TOGETHER WITH THE RIGHT TO TRANSMIT GAS IN AND THROUGH SAID SYSTEM OF CONDUITS, MAINS AND PIPELINES, IN, THROUGH AND ALONG SAID PUBLIC STREETS, LANES, HIGHWAYS, AND PUBLIC WAYS, AND SUCH OTHER EQUIPMENT AS MAY BE APPURTENANT THERETO AND AS

THE GRANTEE OR GRANTEES, HIS, ITS, OR THEIR SUCCESSORS OR ASSIGNS MAY DEEM NECESSARY OR CONVENIENT, IN, UPON, UNDER, ALONG AND ACROSS SAID PUBLIC STREETS, LANES, HIGHWAYS AND PUBLIC WAYS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUPPLYING GAS TO THE PUBLIC AND PARTICULARLY TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE AFORESAID COUNTY, FOR LIGHT, HEAT, POWER OR ANY OF THEM, OR FOR ANY LAWFUL PURPOSE, TOGETHER WITH THE RIGHT TO CONNECT SAID SYSTEM OF CONDUITS, MAINS AND PIPELINES WITH SIMILAR PROPERTY BEYOND THE COUNTY LIMITS, FOR A TERM OF FIFTY (50) YEARS.

WHEREAS, Thebo, Starr and Anderton, Incorporated, a California corporation, on the 31st day of October, 1929, filed an application with the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta, State of California, whereby it sought a franchise upon the terms and conditions set forth in said application, which is on file with said Board of Supervisors, and to which reference is hereby made for greater particularity; and

WHEREAS, the said Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta, State of California did on the 6th day of December, 1929, adopt a resolution declaring its intention to grant and sell said franchise upon the terms and conditions in said resolution set forth; and

WHEREAS, no other or higher bid was filed or made for said franchise,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta, State of California, that the aforesaid right, privilege and franchise to lay, construct, operate, maintain, use, repair, replace, and/or remove, a system of conduits, mains and pipelines, together with such valves, fittings, compressors and other equipment appurtenant/^{there-}to, as the grantee or grantees, his, its, or their, successors or assigns may deem necessary or convenient in, upon, under, along and across public streets, lanes, highways and public ways in the said County, together with the right to transmit gas in and through said system of conduits, mains and pipelines in, through and along said public streets, lanes, highways and public ways, and such other equipment as may be appurtenant thereto and as the grantee or grantees, his, its or their successors or assigns may deem necessary or convenient, in, upon, under, along and across said public streets, lanes, highways and public ways, for the purpose of supplying gas to the public and particularly to the inhabitants of the aforesaid County, for light, heat, power or any of them, or for any lawful purpose, together with the right to connect said system of conduits, mains and pipelines with similar property beyond the County limits, for a term of fifty (50) years, be and the same is hereby struck off, sold and awarded to Thebo, Starr and Anderton, Incorporated, its successors and assigns for the sum of Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars in gold coin of the United States, upon the terms and conditions set forth in said bid, application, notice and resolution to all of which reference is hereby made for a more particular statement of said terms and conditions.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING BUDGET AND FIXING TAX RATE.

Whereas each county official, elective or appointive, in charge of an office, department, service or institution, have filed with the County Auditor on or before the date required by law, a detailed and itemized estimate showing both the probable revenue from sources other than taxation to his department and all expenditures required by his department for the ensuing fiscal year; and the Board of Supervisors having submitted to the County Auditor a statement showing all new road and bridge construction to be financed from any source and also the cost of road and bridge maintenance or betterment and all other expenditures proposed to be made;

And the Auditor having prepared a tabulation according to law showing the complete expenditure program of the county for the current ^{fiscal} year and the sources of revenue by which it is to be financed;

And said tabulation having been submitted by the Auditor to the Board of Supervisors and having been thereupon considered by said board in detail and any revisions, reductions or rates deemed advisable having been made on the date of the said hearing by the Board of Supervisors, and an item to be known as "Unappropriated Reserve" having been added to said tabulation, and also an item known as "General Reserve Fund", and said tabulation thereupon being adopted by the Board of Supervisors as the preliminary county budget;

And the preliminary county budget having been mimeographed in pamphlet form and a notice having been published in a newspaper of general circulation, to-wit; Courier-Free Press, stating that said budget had been prepared and was available for distribution to all tax payers desiring a copy thereof and setting forth that on the 6th day of August, 1930, the Board of Supervisors would meet for the purpose of fixing the final budget and determining tax rates and levies; said notice being given at least ten days before the date of said proposed hearing;

The mileage of said Company in Shasta County is 80.163 and assessed at \$41,500.00 per mile.

It further appearing that the State Board of Equalization on the 1st day of August, 1930, assessed for its rolling stock in the State of California, the Pullman Company, in the aggregate sum of \$6,550,471.00, and of said amount \$102,208.00 was apportioned to Shasta County at the rate of \$1,275.00 per mile.

It is therefore ordered by the Board of Supervisors that said assessment for said companies for Shasta County be apportioned to the several road districts, City of Redding, Townships and School Districts through which said companies run and operate as follows:

"Whereas there is now in process of formation a Joint Highway District composed of the Counties of Shasta and Siskiyou, State of California, which district is being created for the purpose of constructing a highway extending from the Pacific Highway at a point about two miles south of the town of Mt. Shasta City, Siskiyou County, California, leading in a general southeasterly direction through said County of Siskiyou and County of Shasta to connect with the Redding-Alturas lateral of the State Highway, at a point near Fall River Mills, Shasta County, California; and the board of directors of said joint highway district has been duly appointed and organized and said directors are about to submit to this board of supervisors of Shasta County their report under Section 7 of the Joint Highway District Act.

"IT IS THEREFORE DETERMINED AND RESOLVED:

"That Shasta County will contribute the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5000.00) toward the construction of said highway and that this board of Supervisors of Shasta County will approve a report filed by the Board of Directors under Section 7 of the Joint Highway District Act providing that the County of Shasta shall bear \$5000.00 of the cost of said highway; and that it is the intention of this board of supervisors of Shasta County that said sum of \$5000.00 shall be paid by the County of Shasta from the Road District Fund of Road District No. 3 of the County of Shasta at the rate of \$1000.00 per year."

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THAT NOTICE SHALL BE GIVEN OF TENTATIVE APPROVAL
OF FORMATION OF JOINT HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

Before the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta, State of California:

Whereas, this Board of Supervisors of Shasta County did on the 17th day of March, 1930, pass a resolution initiating proceedings for the formation of a Joint Highway District to be composed of the Counties of Shasta, Modoc, Siskiyou, Lassen, Plumas and Butte, State of California, a certified copy of which resolution has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of each of said counties, which resolution of this Board of Supervisors of Shasta County provides as follows:

"(a) That the public interest requires the construction of a system of roads consisting of four public highways connecting existing State and County Highways with the Park road system of Lassen Volcanic National Park, said four public highways (below numbered from one to four inclusive for convenience of designation only) to be located and to extend as follows:

"Highway No. 1, to extend over the most direct feasible route from a point on the Red Bluff-Susanville Highway at or near Chester, Plumas County, California, to a point on the south boundary of Lassen Volcanic National Park about three and one-half miles west from the southeast corner of said National Park;

"Highway No. 2, to extend over the most direct feasible route from a point on the Mt. Shasta-Westwood Highway near Poison Lake, in Lassen County, California, to a point on the north boundary of Lassen Volcanic National Park near the northeast corner of said National Park and on the north boundary of the northwest quarter of section three, township thirty-one north, range six east, M. D. M.;

"Highway No. 3, to extend over the most direct feasible route from a point on the Redding-Alturas Highway at or near Cassel, Shasta County, California, to a point on the north boundary of Lassen Volcanic National Park near the northwest corner of said National Park and on the north boundary of the southwest quarter of section three, township thirty-one north, range four east, M.D.M.; and

"Highway No. 4, to extend over the most direct feasible route from a point on the west boundary of Lassen Volcanic National Park near the northwest corner of said National Park and near the line dividing sections 7 and 18, Tp. 31 N., R. 4 E., M.D.M. to a point on the Pacific Highway at or near the City of Redding, California, or between Redding and the southerly boundary of Shasta County, California.

"(b) That the names of the counties which will be interested in and which will be benefited by the construction of said four public highways are the counties of Shasta, Modoc, Siskiyou, Lassen, Plumas, and Butte; State of California.

"(c) That for the purpose of accomplishing the construction of said four public highways, it is hereby proposed to create a joint highway district to be composed of the counties so named, to-wit, said counties of Shasta, Modoc, Siskiyou, Lassen, Plumas, and Butte."

And whereas the Board of Supervisors of each of said counties of Shasta, Modoc, Siskiyou, Lassen, Plumas and Butte has duly and regularly adopted and passed a resolution giving tentative approval of the formation of said joint highway district described in said resolution passed and adopted by this Board of Supervisors of Shasta County on the 17th day of March, 1930, and a certified copy of each resolution giving tentative approval of the formation of said joint highway district passed and adopted by the Board of Supervisors of each of said counties of Shasta, Modoc, Siskiyou, Lassen, Plumas and Butte has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of Shasta County;

NOW, THEREFORE, this Board of Supervisors of Shasta County does ^{hereby} order, resolve and determine:

That the Board of Supervisors of each of the counties of Shasta, Modoc, Siskiyou, Lassen, Plumas and Butte has given tentative approval of the formation of the joint highway district above described;

That the Clerk of this Board of Supervisors of Shasta County shall immediately notify the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of each of said counties of Modoc, Siskiyou, Lassen, Plumas and Butte that tentative approval of the formation of said joint highway district has been given by the several counties effected, to-wit, the counties of Shasta, Modoc, Siskiyou, Lassen, Plumas and Butte, by transmitting a duly certified copy of this resolution to the Clerk of each of said Board of Supervisors of the Counties of Modoc, Siskiyou, Lassen,

Plumas and Butte, to be filed with the Board of Supervisors of each of said counties. Passed by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta, State of California, this 3rd day of September, 1930.
