

## RESOLUTION 2024-

### A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SHASTA OPPOSING 2023 CALIFORNIA STATE SENATE BILL 2 AND SUPPORTING CITIZEN RIGHTS ESTABLISHED BY THE SECOND AMENDMENT OF THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION

**WHEREAS**, on September 26, 2023, Governor Newsom signed Senate Bill 2 (SB 2) into law, amending sections of the Penal Code related to carrying concealed firearms and Carry Concealed Weapons Licenses (CCW); and

**WHEREAS**, SB 2 was chaptered by the Secretary of State on September 26, 2023, and became effective on January 1, 2024; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 25, 2023, the Shasta County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 2023-079 which supports the Second Amendment of the United States Bill of Rights and the Constitution, and declares that the Board of Supervisors will support and defend the rights, as outlined in the Second Amendment, of Shasta County's diverse community, comprising people of various ethnic, religious, and political groups with a population of over 180,000 residents, who may or may not choose to own a firearm, or exercise their right to lawfully carry a firearm.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Supervisors, as the chief executive body of Shasta County, has the legal and moral authority to ensure the general safety and welfare of all county properties, activities, employees, and public having business with the County.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Supervisors considers SB 2, a law passed by the California Legislature, as unconstitutional under the Second Amendment, and unconstitutionally infringes upon the people's right to bear arms.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** pursuant to Section 171b(b)(4) of the Penal Code, the Board of Supervisors, as the duly authorized official entity in charge of security of local County buildings, permits and authorizes Shasta County employees, all members of the public, including peace officers and retired peace officers, as described in the Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act (LEOSA) of 2004, who possess a valid California Carry Concealed Weapons License (CCW) and registered, permitted firearm, to do so on County property, except where otherwise exempted by County Policy, State, and Federal law.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** the Board of Supervisors encourages all local businesses to post notices similar to **Exhibit A, Notice of Lawful Concealed Carry**, attached hereto and incorporated herein, to reaffirm the rights of all citizens in Shasta County and comply with California law.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta supports all discussions seeking new ideas to protect all citizens from potential violence and criminal activity, and declares that, to the maximum extent allowed by law, it will not abide by any order, provision, law, or agency initiative that violates the Constitution of the United States, the California Constitution, or the Second Amendment.
