It shall be the duty of every health care provider, knowing of or in attendance on a case or suspected case of any of the diseases or conditions listed above to report to the local health officer for the jurisdiction where the patient resides. Where no health care provider is in attendance, any individual having knowledge of a person who is suspected to be suffering from one of the diseases or conditions listed above may make such a report. "Health care provider" encompasses physicians, surgeons, veterinarians, podiatrists, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, registered nurses, nurse midwives, school nurses, infection control practitioners, medical

examiners, coroners, dentists and chiropractors.
