KIDS SICK WITH LEAD DON'T LOOK SICK



Lead poisoning can harm a child's brain and cause learning and behavior problems that may last a lifetime. Most children who are poisoned by lead do not look or act sick. Symptoms, if present, may be confused with

common childhood complaints, like stomachache, crankiness, loss of appetite or headaches.

You might see these symptoms:

Nausea, anemia, constipation, weight loss, inability to sleep, irritability, dizziness, headache. A blood test is the ONLY way to know the Blood Lead Level (BLL) of your child.

Talk to your child's health care provider to see if your child is at risk for lead poisoning.



Children can show their teeth some love by drinking water instead of sugary drinks to prevent tooth decay. Along with drinking water, regular dental visits will help children's teeth be healthy. For children and teens, Medi-Cal covers dental check-ups twice a year and sometimes more.


