Raylene McNeal discussed a cycle of 24-hour holds and the perception of lack of family rights. Mary Sutter discussed the impact of anosognosia and the plight of families who are forced to choose between providing emergency housing to their ill family member and accessing a full range of services. Marcy Fernandez discussed stigma and lack of available care for those with a concurrent diagnosis of SMI and SUD. Mary cited a need for intensive treatment services and the detrimental effect of gaps in service when transitioning between programs. ➢ Guest Dillon E.
