III. Discussion	CONDUCT A FACILITY TOUR OF VISIONS OF THE CROSS.		
	Visions of the Cross (VOTC) is a state-licensed residential		
	and outpatient substance use disorder (SUD) treatment		
	and recovery community. VOTC is inclusive of all faiths		
	and provides evidence-based, recovery-focused services		
	to approximately 250-300 clients per month. With a total		
	of 39 houses spanning three blocks and 24-hour staffing,		
	levels of care include residential treatment, intensive		
	assisted outpatient treatment (IOT), outpatient		
	treatment, and individualized treatment plans. VOTC		
	contracts with Family Dynamics, a local therapy provider		
	for mental health and trauma-informed care, parenting		
	skill-building and anger management. In response to		
	COVID-19 pandemic restrictions, residences are now		
	fitted with Zoom capability for virtual treatment access,		
	and an on-site gym has been established.		
	VOTC partners with Shasta County to deliver the Families		
	Living in a Therapeutic Environment (FLITE) Program, in		
	which a multidisciplinary team offers 6 months of		
	wraparound services designed, empower parents with an		
	open child welfare case to have a safe sober environment		
	and a team of people to help them parent their children.		
	VOTC also collaborates with probation and other local		
	healthcare agencies to provide quality care and referrals		
	for the client. VOTC also contracts with some surrounding		
	counties that do not have Partnership Health.		
	Thirty out of forty of VOTC's staff members are former		
	clients. VOTC covers schooling and registration costs for		

	dedicated employees who wish to become certified counselors.		
	VOTC's acceptance of Partnership HealthPlan of California (PHC) insurance has increased access for people for whom funding for treatment had been an issue. PHC members may contact Beacon (<u>PHC and Beacon</u>) for referral to VOTC. Residential admission is dependent upon bed availability, while outpatient services can be accessed more quickly.
