What is it?

Staphylococcus aureus (S. aureus) is a type of bacteria that is commonly carried on the skin or in the nose of healthy people. Some S. aureus are resistant to a medicine that kills the bacteria - an antibiotic called methicillin - and are referred to as Methicillin Resistant Staphylococcus Aureus or MRSA.

Symptoms

Symptoms of a Staph/MRSA infection may include redness, warmth, swelling, fever, tenderness of the skin, or boils/ blisters. What may appear to be a spider bite may actually be signs of Staph/MRSA infection and prompt medical attention is necessary.

How is Infection Prevented?

Pay attention to the 4 C's:

Cuts: Keep cuts and scrapes clean with soap and water

Contact: Avoid skin contact and sharing of personal items with infected individuals

Thoroughly clean objects and surfaces that are shared with others Clean: Make an appointment with a doctor if a skin infection is present
