<p>Group BH Prev Education/Peer Svcs</p> <p>15 min increments</p>	<p>Educational Groups: Providing a supportive environment in which beneficiaries and their families learn coping mechanisms and problem-solving skills in order to help the beneficiary achieve desired outcomes. These groups should promote skill building for the beneficiary in the areas of socialization, recovery, self-sufficiency, self-advocacy, development of natural supports, and maintenance of skills learned in other support services.</p>	<p>H0025</p>	<p>51</p>	<p>Primary</p>
<p>Individual Self-help/Peer Svcs</p> <p>15 min increments</p>	<p>Peer support services are culturally competent individual and group services that promote recovery, resiliency, engagement, socialization, self-advocacy, development of natural supports, and identification of strengths through structured activities such as group and individual coaching to set recovery goals and identify steps to reach the goals. Services aim to prevent relapse, empower beneficiaries through strength-based coaching, support linkages to community resources, and to educate beneficiaries and their families about their condition and the process of recovery.</p>	<p>H0038</p>	<p>51</p>	<p>Primary</p>
<p>Crisis-MH including mobile</p> <p>15 min increments</p>	<p>An unplanned, expedited service, to or on behalf of a beneficiary to address a condition that requires more timely response than a regularly scheduled visit. Crisis intervention is an emergency response service enabling a beneficiary to cope with a crisis, while assisting the beneficiary in regaining their status as a functioning community member. The goal of crisis intervention is to stabilize an immediate crisis within a community or clinical treatment setting.</p> <p>Crisis intervention may be provided face-to-face, by telephone or by telemedicine with the beneficiary and/or significant support persons and may be provided in a clinic setting or anywhere in the community.</p>	<p>H2011</p>	<p>70</p>	<p>Primary</p>
