NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, pursuant to applicable law, that the Shasta County Planning Director has determined that the proposed uses meet all applicable criteria and on **Tuesday, April 16, 2024**, intends to approve the following Administrative Permit:

Ronald L. and Ellen McCormick have requested approval of an Administrative Permit to exceed the total combined residential accessory building floor area limit of 2,500-square-feet and to exceed the 20-foot maximum structural height restriction for an accessory building located less than 50 feet from a property line for a proposed 22-foot 3-inch tall, 3,000-square-foot shop with two 960-square-foot overhangs, located 30-feet from the northern property line.
