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6. Resident stated he had a migraine and ended up vomiting. Nurse Robert came to evaluate him and his blood pressure and heart rate were elevated. Nurse then advised to have the resident stay in his room.

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7. **Suicidal Ideation:** Resident was seen with a small puncture wound on her wrist that was no longer bleeding. She was taken to medical where she stated she did not want to kill herself, she just wanted attention because the other kids are mean.

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8. **Suicidal Ideation:** Resident was seen scratching her arm. When asked what she was doing she said she just wanted to kill herself. Once she was taken off the pod she said she really didn't want to kill herself. Tracie from Wellpath was called and is very familiar with the resident. She said no further action was needed.

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9. **Suicidal Ideation:** Resident started yelling that he was going to kill himself, he was observed pruned out with his sweatshirt around his neck. Officers talked to him and the sweatshirt was removed. Without incident the resident was placed in his room, calmed down and was able to return to his free recreation.
