There was a marked difference between the openness and appearance between each different pod, which is by design. However, the 900-pod youth definitely seemed more detached from relationships than the other two youth. This may be due to age differences but may also be due to the structure of the program in each pod. Staff noted there are JDO's trained in peer support.

He did note that it would be nice to have more D&A groups to attend. The third youth stated he participates in MRT, ART and individual therapy as well as school. He said ART has helped him the most and was able to explain a few principles from ART that he has used to help him avoid fighting with other residents. He suggested that kids be held accountable to pay attention when doing ART via zoom, as he sees that many just goof off or don't get what they need to out of it. He prefers in person sessions.
