Comments:	The JDO in the room was during youth interviews was very friendly and it was obvious that the youth had a good relationship with him; especially the youth from Rivers Edge Academy and the 800 pod as they both laughed and made some jokes with the JDO. There was a marked difference between the openness and appearance between each different pod, which is by design. However, the 900-pod youth definitely seemed more detached from relationships than the other two youth. This may be due to age differences but may also be due to the structure of the program in each pod. Staff noted there are JDO's trained in peer support.

It was explained to me how the program seeks to decrease dependance upon the rules and structure of the JRF in the highest phase when the youth can be away from the JRF for hours and days. The other two youth understood the level system. One youth noted the level system his helpful to motivate people and stated that he is the highest level amongst his peers right now. On the Honors level he said he gets held to a higher expectation and is allowed to do extra things like laundry and work in the kitchen. He is also asked to be a role model for others. The third youth interviewed said it is pretty easy to do a good job if you just comply with instructions.
Comments:	Staff noted there needs to be more consistency in rule enforcement among staff, so the youth know exactly what to expect.

Comments:	<p>Programs are comprehensive and inclusive. One youth noted he was engaged in 7 different groups that are designed to work on anger management, self-mastery, leadership, and process trauma issues. He said he is learning a lot of helpful coping skills from ART, MRT and CBT groups as well as learning to deal with his past trauma in individual therapy. Another youth noted that there are 5 different groups he participates in, and he finds the drug and alcohol group most helpful as that is what he said he struggles with the most. He did note that it would be nice to have more D&A groups to attend. The third youth stated he participates in MRT, ART and individual therapy as well as school. He said ART has helped him the most and was able to explain a few principles from ART that he has used to help him avoid fighting with other residents. He suggested that kids be held accountable to pay attention when doing ART via zoom, as he sees that many just goof off or don't get what they need to out of it. He prefers in person sessions.</p>

USE OF FORCE				

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Comments:				Staff are trained to appropriately handle incidents and all incidents of force are reviewed by an internal Use of Force Board. One youth rated the facility as a 9.5 to 10 out of 10 in safety. Another youth interviewed had a marked difference in his response about safety in the facility. He said he feels safe, and the staff do a good job, but his reference focused on how they respond to fights. He said they do a good job using spray on the person who is the aggressor in the fight. He explained that they do not spray the person who is walking away or trying to de-escalate. He also said he feels like the decontamination process performed after getting sprayed takes a long time, but he said it may just be his perception.
