Meeting Overview

The meeting was called to order at 2:33 p.m. A quorum was present. Introductions were made.

Public Comment

None

Approval of Meeting Minutes

Donnell Ewert moved to approve the June 16, 2021 meeting minutes. Melissa Fowler-Bradley seconded the motion. Motion passed: 8 Ayes, 0 Noes, with 1 Abstention (Roxanne Burke).

Financial Report

Jenn Rossi provided the financial report on the state allocation to Shasta County and reported that things are looking good fiscally. February's deposit was our largest so far this year.

Discussion Items

CCPEC members shall provide a summary of Executive Committee activities since June 16, 2021

Tracie Neal provided a brief recap of a presentation done by the DRC last August. This was followed by a review of the annual report as well as a report on CCP membership and vacancy. Sheriff Michael Johnson joined the membership and replaced Eric Magrini. Tracie mentioned the presentation done by Robert Bowman from STEP-UP regarding their trip to Denver, Colorado earlier this year for a conference. Lastly, she mentioned the compliance presentation.

CCPEC members will receive a presentation from Shasta County Office of Education (SCOE) staff on Community Connect data from school year 2021-22 and middle/high school Student Attendance Review Boards (SARB) the targeted case manager model in school year 2021-22.

Tracie opened this segment by stating Community Connect has been partially funded by innovation sub-account dollars.

April Matthews, Lena Mitchell, and Wendy Hall from SCOE provided the presentation. They opined how Shasta County schools are above the state average for absenteeism. They discussed SARB level of need versus support. For each SARB meeting a case management is offered. A variety of intervention strategies are also offered. They stressed the importance of SARB being more fluid and flexible in relation to the needs of families. There had been 630 referrals as of that morning, drawn from 58-59 local schools. The data for SARB 2021/22 is lower, they stated, which is a good thing. Schools are working hard to assist families before SARB invitations. Matthews, Mitchell, and Hall also touched on attendance and behavior referrals. Seventy percent of families engaged the program, pre-SARB. A good report was shared of one such family, with thanks given to James Goodwine for his role.

Committee members will receive a presentation from Eric Jones, Adult Division Director on Mandatory Supervision (MS) offenders.

Director Jones began by giving a brief overview of Mandatory Supervision. Eric provided an over of data since October 2011 and discussed the types of sentences and outcome data. A data and outcome chart would be handed out at a future meeting.

Committee members will receive an update from Bill Schueller, Chief of Redding Police Department on the Crisis Intervention Response Team.

Redding Police Chief Schueller was not available for this meeting. His presentation has been postponed for a later date. In the meantime, Donnell Ewert asked Paige Green if she could provide the committee with information regarding the CIRT.

Paige responded by sharing that clinicians and Redding police officers have been seeing success with the CIRT. There is currently an effort to find funding to launch a second CIRT team and make the program run seven days a week.

Committee members will receive additional information from Sheriff Johnson on compliance efforts from the Sheriff's Office. A larger presentation on compliance efforts was presented at the February 9, 2022 CCP Executive Committee.

Michael Lindsay from the Sheriff's Office explained the CCP budget for compliance and how the data was being tracked.
