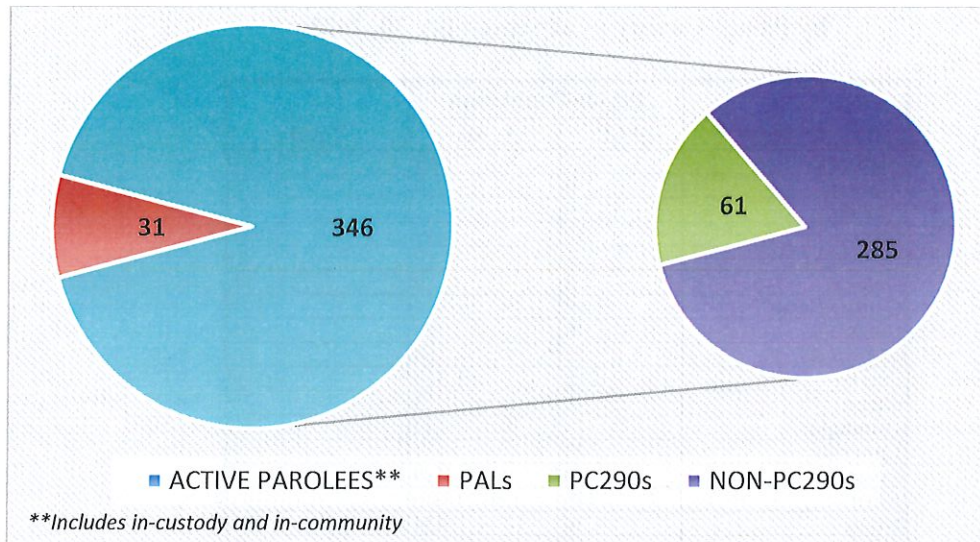

PAROLEE POPULATION\*: 377

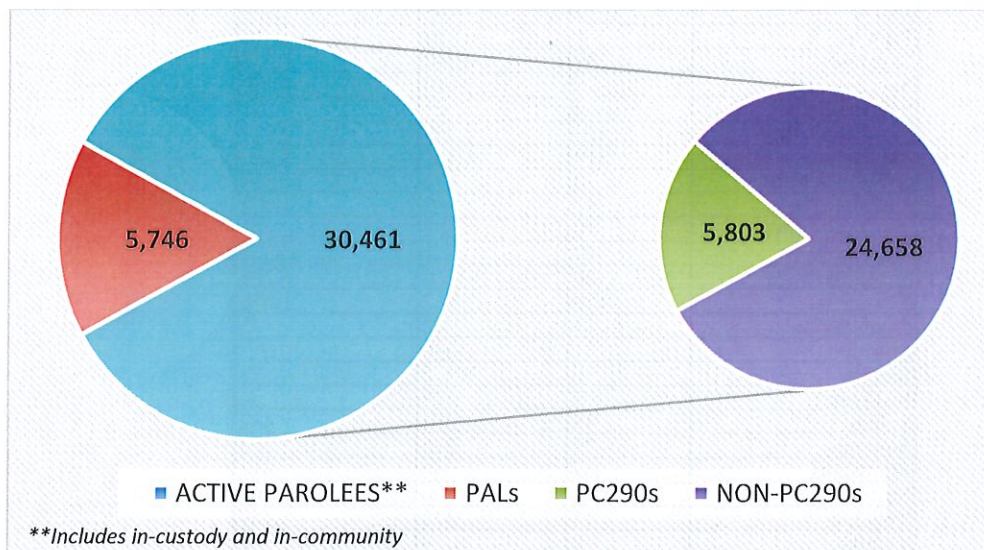

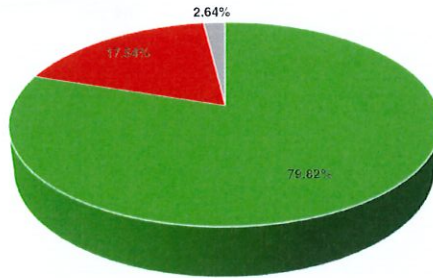






# CCP POST GRADUATE EMPLOYMENT
