1. **Injury/Illness:** A resident received bruises after they punched themselves in the face and hit their face against a wall. Resident was offered ice but declined it. Incident required no medical attention.
2. **Injury/Illness:** A resident stabbed themselves with a pencil, breaking the skin. When staff asked them why the resident stated they were bored. Further medical attention was not needed.
3. **Injury illness:** A resident rolled their ankle during LME. Resident declined ice pack at first stating that they felt little pain. Resident then asked and received ice later when their ankle appeared swollen. Later resident stated that they had a little limp and little pain but that was it.
4. **Suicide Ideation:** When a resident completed a MAYSI-2 it was found that they scored a 4 in the suicidal ideation column. Shasta County Mental Health was notified and mental health stated they would follow up.
5. **Suicide Ideation:** An upset resident confided to a staff member they had thoughts of hurting themselves. They also stated they were unsure as to why they were having these thoughts and had no plans to carry them out. Shasta County Mental Health was notified and resident completed a MAYSI-2 and Suicide Screening.
